Designation of Alternate Scholars in the Academic Excellence Scholarship Program

Motion:

Move to modify the academic excellence scholarship program by specifying that the current law requirement that alternate academic excellence scholars have the same grade point average as the originally designated scholar or scholars would not apply for pupils who attend a high school that applies different weights to different courses in determining a pupil's grade point average. Provide that if a senior from such a high school of at least 80 pupils who is designated as a scholar does not qualify for the award, an alternate for the scholar with the same grade point average, or if there is no senior with the same grade point average, an alternate with the next highest grade point average, would be designated as eligible to receive the award, ~~until the scholarship may be awarded~~. Provide that if a senior from such a high school of less than 80 pupils who is designated as a scholar does not qualify for the award, an alternate for the scholar with the same grade point average, or if there is no senior with the same grade point average, an alternate with the next highest grade point average, would be designated as eligible to receive the award, ~~until the scholarship may be awarded~~ by HEAB.

Note:

The academic excellence scholarship (AES) program provides scholarships to selected 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who have the highest grade point average (GPA) in each public and private high school in the state and who attend a participating postsecondary institution in Wisconsin. The number of scholarships for which each high school is eligible is based on total student enrollment. For high schools with total enrollments of less than 80 students, no more than ten scholarships, in aggregate, may be awarded. Under HEAB administrative rule, the ten students with the highest GPAs are awarded scholarships. For those high schools with enrollments greater than 80 students, the faculty of each public or private high school is required to name the 12<sup>th</sup> grade student with the highest GPA, as it is normally determined by that high school, as eligible to receive a scholarship. If two or more students from the same high school have the same GPA, the faculty of the high

school is required to select the student or students to receive the scholarship and designate the other student or students as alternates. If the student who is initially selected does not use the scholarship by September 30 following high school graduation, the scholarship is awarded to the alternate.

This motion would exempt high schools that use a course weighting system from the current law requirement that an alternate for a designated academic excellence scholar have the same grade point average as the scholar for which he or she is designated an alternate. Therefore, if a designated scholar from such a high school would not use the scholarship by September 30 following high school graduation and no other senior from that high school has the same GPA as the originally designated scholar, the scholarship would be awarded to the senior with the next highest GPA, until the scholarship could be awarded.

The fiscal effect of this motion cannot be determined. However, to the extent that the proposed modification to the program would increase the number of students eligible to be designated as alternates, this motion would increase expenditures for the program.
