HEALTH AND FAMILY SERVICES -- PUBLIC HEALTH

Consolidated Contracts

Motion:

Move to require DHFS to obtain approval from the Joint Committee on Finance to consolidate contracts related to public health programs.

Under these provisions, if DHFS proposed to consolidate contracts into one single contract to cover care or services under more than one program administered by the DHFS Division of Public Health, it would be required to submit the contract to the Co-chairs of the Committee. Specify that the proposed contract would detail the programs that would be under the contract, the allocation of funding for each program and the performance outcome incentives and disincentives offered under the contract. Specify that this request would be submitted under 14-day passive review.

These provisions would apply to contracts entered into on the general effective date of the bill.

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Note:

In a memorandum dated April 7, 1999, addressed to local public health departments and service providers, DHFS Secretary Lekan outlines the Department's plan for consolidating public health contracts.

Under this plan, funding for the following seven programs would be consolidated into one contract: (a) childhood lead poisoning prevention; (b) preventive health and health services block grant funding; (c) Wisconsin women's cancer control program; (d) immunization outreach and education funding; and (e) family planning funding. This contract would be effective January 1, 2000. Funding for the supplemental food program for women, infants and children (WIC) may be included in the contract as of January 1, 2001.

1 AN ACT to create 46.036 (8) of the statutes; relating to: requiring the  
 2 department of health and family services to obtain approval from the joint  
 3 committee on finance to consolidate contracts related to public health  
 4 programs.

**Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau**

This bill requires the department of health and family services (DHFS) to seek approval from the joint committee on finance (JCF) for any contract that would consolidate several contracts for the provision of care or services under more than one program administered by the subunit of DHFS that is primarily responsible for administering public health. Under the bill, if the cochairpersons of JCF do not, within 14 working days after receiving the proposed contract, notify the secretary of DHFS that they have scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the contract, DHFS may enter into the contract. Otherwise, DHFS may not enter into the contract except as approved by JCF.

**TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 133 AND 1999 SENATE BILL 45**

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 1. Page 577, line 4: after that line insert:

3 “SECTION 999m. 46.036 (8) of the statutes is created to read:

4 46.036 (8) If the department proposes to consolidate contracts into one single  
5 contract to cover care or services under more than one program administered by the  
6 subunit of the department that is primarily responsible for administering public  
7 health, the department shall submit the proposed contract to the cochairpersons of  
8 the joint committee on finance. The proposed contract shall detail the programs for  
9 which care or services are being contracted, the allocation of funds for each program  
10 and outcome performance incentives and disincentives offered under the contract.  
11 If the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the secretary of the department  
12 within 14 working days after receiving the proposed contract that the cochairpersons

1 have scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the contract, the department  
2 may enter into the contract as proposed. If, within 14 working days after receiving  
3 the proposed contract, the cochairpersons notify the secretary of ~~the department~~ that  
4 the cochairpersons have scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the  
5 proposed contract, the department may not enter into the contract except as  
6 approved by the committee.”

7 **2.** Page 1453, line 17: after that line insert:

8 “(11m) CONSOLIDATED CONTRACTS. The treatment of section 46.036 (8) of the  
9 statutes first applies to contracts entered into on the effective date of this  
10 subsection.”
