Increase the fee for the issuance of a duplicate birth certificate from \$12 to \$13.40 and specify that \$1.40 of the amount collected for issuing a copy of a birth certificate would be forwarded to the State Treasurer and deposited in the newborn hearing screening program appropriation. Specify that the increased fee for issuing a birth certificate would be effective 30 days after the general effective date of the bill, until December 31, 2002. As of January 1, 2003, the fee would be \$12.

Beginning July 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, require DHFS to collect information from hospitals for the previous calendar year on the number of deliveries in each hospital and whether the hospital has a newborn hearing screening program. 
Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides funding from general purpose revenues for three fiscal years, beginning July 1, 1999, for grants to be awarded by the department of health and family services (DHFS) to applying hospitals for the initial costs of establishing newborn hearing screening programs, under which infants may be tested to determine if they have hearing loss. The bill requires DHFS, beginning January 1, 2002, annually to collect information from hospitals concerning the numbers of deliveries in each hospital and the availability of newborn hearing screening programs. From this information DHFS must, by January 31, 2003, and annually thereafter, determine the percentage of deliveries that are performed in hospitals that have newborn hearing screening programs and report the percentage to the legislature. If, by February 5, 2003, DHFS determines that fewer than 88% of all deliveries are performed in hospitals that have newborn hearing screening programs and so notifies the hospitals, every hospital must, by July 1, 2003, have a newborn hearing screening program that is available to all infants who are delivered in the hospital.




