Definition of a Moped

740.01(20m)

Motion:

Move to modify the definition of a moped to include a bicycle-type vehicle with fully operative pedals for propulsion by human power and an engine certified by the manufacturer at between 50 cubic centimeters and 130 cubic centimeters or an equivalent power unit, provided that the top speed of the vehicle is not more than 30 miles per hour.

Note:

Under current law, a moped is defined, for the purposes of vehicle registration and traffic laws, as a vehicle with a top speed of 30 miles per hour that is either: (a) a motorcycle with an automatic transmission and an engine certified by the manufacturer at not more than 50 cubic centimeters of an equivalent power unit; or (b) a bicycle-type vehicle with fully operative pedals for propulsion by human power and an engine certified by the manufacturer at not more than 50 cubic centimeters of an equivalent power unit.

This motion would increase the size of the engine that a bicycle-type moped may have to 130 cubic centimeters, as long as the top speed is still under 30 miles per hour. This would reclassify a vehicle that fits this description from a motor bicycle, for which registration is not required, to a moped, for which registration is required.

Jon Dyck:

This amendment might conflict with a federal definition of moped, or motorized bicycles. Although I am not aware of a specific definition that conflicts, I did find a proposed definition from 1981 that limited the engine displacement to 50cc or limited the "brake horsepower" to 2. See 46 Reg. 59689, December 7, 1981, soliciting comments for a proposed definition change for purposes of NHTSA's guidelines for State moped safety programs.

HURA

Note that this change affects moped dealers under s. 218.41, by removing these 50cc–130cc vehicles from the definition of "motor vehicle" under s. 218.01 (1) (m) and making them "mopeds" under s. 218.40 (2). Please verify that the effects on ch. 218 are as you intended.

This change exempts 50cc-130cc motor bicycles from emission limitations [s. 285.30(5)(s) allows them to be parked on sidewalks [s. 346.54(1)(e)] and exempts them from requirements of motor vehicle consumer leases [s. 429.104 (19)]. Ok?
