# NATURAL RESOURCES - FISH AND WILDLIFE

Collection of Social Security Numbers under ALIS
[Paper #667]

Motion:

Move to specify that, if the federal government enacts another system of maintaining a database of persons for child support enforcement that does not involve the collection of social security numbers, that the Department seek any necessary statutory changes with respect to the sale of hunting and fishing licenses to allow Wisconsin to comply with the system.

In addition, require the state to seek a waiver from the federal government regarding the collection of social security numbers related to child support enforcement

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Note:

Under current law, DNR collects social security numbers as part of the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 for child support enforcement purposes. Under ALIS, a license buyer provides the social security number the first time a purchase is made from the system, after which he or she is provided with a unique DNR customer number that can be used in subsequent transactions.

#### TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 133 AND 1999 SENATE BILL 45

Alternative to providing social security numbers.

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At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 502, line 21: after that line insert:

"Section 722m 29.024 (2g) (e)of the statutes is created to read:

29.024 (2g) (e) If the federal government allows a method under the system under s. 49.857 (2) for purposes of administering this subsection that does not need the use of social security numbers of individuals applying for or holding approvals, the department shall request that the legislative reference bureau prepare legislation that allows compliance with that method and that eliminates the requirement that individuals provide their social security numbers under the system. The secretary shall submit the proposed legislation to the standing

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committee of each house of the legislature that has jurisdiction fish and wildlife matters.".
