It is possible that a Wisconsin court would find that this amendment is a "private or local law" which, under art. If so, this amendment cannot validly be enacted as part of the budget bill, which clearly encompasses more than one subject. Under Milwaukee Brewers Baseball Club v. Wisconsin Dept. of Health and Social Services, 130 Wis. 2d 79, 115 (1986), "a legislative provision which is specific to any person, place or thing is a private or local law within the meaning of art. 4, sec. 18, unless: 1) the general subject matter of the provision relates to a state responsibility of statewide dimension; and 2) its enactment will have direct and immediate effect on a specific statewide concern or interest".
