Move to incorporate the following provisions into the bill:

Tobacco Control Program

Tobacco Control Advisory Council. Create a 20-member tobacco control advisory council (the "Council"), which would consist of: (a) the Attorney General of his or her designee; (b) one majority party senator, one minority party senator, one majority party representative to the Assembly and one minority party representative to the Assembly, appointed as are the members of standing committees in their respective houses; (c) the DHFS Secretary or his or her designee; (d) the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his or her designee; (e) one physician with expertise in oncology, smoking cessation or public health; (f) one student from the University of Wisconsin System; (g) two high school students, including at least one minority student; (h) five representatives of organizations that have as their primary organizational mission reducing the health or conomic consequences of tobacco use or ameliorating the effects of tobacco use and reducing the incidence of particular diseases or health conditions associated with tobacco use; (i) one local health officer; (j) a member of the state's grocers association; (k) one person who is a minority group member; and (l) a member of the Wisconsin Health and Hospital Association.

Specify that the 13 nonpublic Council members would be appointed for three-year terms by the Governor, except that if a student member loses the status upon which the appointment was based, he or she would cease to be a Council member. Specify that the Governor would appoint one member of the Council to serve as the chairperson. Specify that the Council would meet at least four times per year, eleven members would constitute a quorum and that for the purpose of conducting business and exercising its power, a majority vote of the Council is required. Authorize the Council to create subcommittees to assist in its work, and if the Council creates subcommittees, specify that one subcommittee would address the issue of populations most adversely affected by tobacco.

Segregated Fund. Establish a segregated, nonlapsible fund called the "Tobacco Control Fund" to support activities related to a statewide comprehensive tobacco control program. Create a segregated aids appropriation and a program operations appropriation in the Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS), Division of Public of Public Health (DPH) to support grants under and the administration of a statewide tobacco control program.

Statewide Tobacco Control Program. Require DHFS to develop a statewide tobacco control program in consultation with the Council. Require the Council to develop program and budget recommendations for a statewide tobacco control program and submit these recommendations to the DHFS Secretary by February 1, annually, beginning on February 1, 2000. Require DHFS to review these recommendations and to prepare the detailed annual budget for a statewide tobacco control program. Require DHFS to submit a detailed budget to the Joint Committee on Finance by March 1, annually, beginning on March 1, 2000, under a 14-day passive review process. Specify that \$30.9 million SEG in 2000-01 would be placed in the Committee's SEG appropriation for release once the Joint Committee on Finance has reviewed and approved the annual budget for the program.

Specify that the distribution of funding between the various components of the statewide tobacco control program budget would be based on the U.S. Centers for Disease Control's funding allocation recommendations for comprehensive tobacco control programs. In addition, specify that monies deposited in the tobacco control fund could only be used to support the following activities: (a) community programs to reduce tobacco use; (b) community programs to reduce the burden of tobacco-related diseases; (c) school programs; (d) enforcement of policies restricting access to tobacco products and reducing exposure to second hand smoke; (e) partnership grants with statewide organizations and businesses; (f) counter-marketing; (g) cessation programs; (h) surveillance and evaluation; (i) administration and management; and (j) projects designed to reduce tobacco use among minorities and pregnant women.

Require DHFS and the Council to consider successful tobacco control programs in other states when developing their recommendations. In addition, require DHFS to solicit input from the Council regarding the selection of specific programs or activities to be funded under the statewide tobacco control program.

Specify that, notwithstanding these provisions, tobacco control funds could be used to support the minority health program and FQHC grants created under this motion.

Specify that in 2000-01 up to \$150,000 would be allocated for grants to schools offering instruction in grades six, seven or eight that purchase or have purchased in 1998-99 the smoking/tobacco component of the Body Awareness Resource Network (BARN) software. Tobacco-Related Provisions Contained in Budget Bill. Specify that \$300,000 annually of the amounts in the tobacco control aids appropriation would be provided to support a minority health program, notwithstanding the requirement to obtain approval from the Committee Create a minority health program that would provide \$300,000 SFG annually to support the following activities: (a) a grant of up to \$100,000 annually for a private nonprofit corporation to conduct a public information campaign on minority health; and (b) \$200,000 annually for grants of amounts up to \$50,000 to conduct activities relating to the improvement of the health status of economically disadvantaged minority group members. Analysis by the Legislative/Reference Bureau

In November 1998, Wisconsin and 45 other states entered into the Attorneys General Master Tobacco Settlement (settlement) with the tobacco industry, which requires tobacco companies to make payments to the states in perpetuity. Under the settlement, it is estimated that Wisconsin will receive a total of \$5.9 billion through 2025.

This bill directs that the first \$50\million received annually under the settlement be deposited into a segregated fund. Under the bill, moneys deposited into the fund may only be used for the costs associated with providing grants to organizations for activities related to smoking cessation and tobacco use reduction.

The bill also creates an independent board composed of the attorney general, two senators and two representatives of the assembly (one from each party in each house); the secretary of health and family services; the superintendent of public instruction; one physician with expertise in oncology, smoking cessation or public health; one student from the University of Wisconsin System; two high school students; five representatives of organizations that have as their primary organizational mission reducing the health or economic consequences of tobacco use or ameliorating the effects of tobacco use and reducing incidence of particular diseases or health conditions associated with tobacco use; one local health officer; and one person who is a minority group member.

Move to provide \$100,000 GPR annually to Mary Mahoney Health Services, Inc. to support nurse-managed health centers in the City of Milwaukee. In addition, delete \$85,000, which was earmarked for Rainbow Community Health Center, from the Committee's supplemental appropriation.

Note:

Mary Mahoney Health Services Inc. operates three nurse-managed health centers in the City of Milwaukee. The Metcalfe Park Health Centers is located in the Metcalfe Park neighborhood and has been operating since 1991. The Hillside Family Health Center provides services to the residents of the Hillside Housing Development and the immediate surrounding neighborhood. Andrew Douglas Community Health Center is located in a Milwaukee public middle school and provides services to individuals in the area four community development block grant strategic planning area.

In 1998, these clinics provided approximately 5,200 clinic visits to 2,900 individuals. In that year, 74% of clients had income below the federal poverty level and 38% of clients were uninsured. The most common diagnoses of the population served by these clinics is asthma, hypertension and diabetes.

This motion would provide funding to support salaries of nurses who conduct home visits, provide health education and individual health counseling at the three clinics. Funding would also be used to purchase medication and support laboratory costs on behalf of uninsured clients at all three clinics.

In addition, this motion would delete \$85,000 GPR annually that the Committee had previously budgeted in its supplemental appropriation. However, the \$1 million GPR funding to support start-up costs for a successor to Rainbow Center and the funding provided for FQHCs including Rainbow, would be maintained.
