Nonmetallic Mining Reclamation Program Requirements

Motion:

Move to exempt nonmetallic mining conducted to obtain stone, soil, sand or grayel for the construction, maintenance or repair of a highway, railroad, airport facility, or any other transportation facility from the requirements for a reclamation plan, for public notice and an opportunity for a public informational hearing and for proof of financial responsibility if the nonmetallic mining is conducted under contract with a city, village, town, county, county utility district, town sanitary district, public inland lake protection and rehabilitation district or metropolitan sewage district and the contract requires the nonmetallic mining to be conducted in accordance with the Department of Transportation's requirements concerning the restoration of the nonmetallic mining site.

Note:

THE PROPERTY OF THE PARTY OF TH

Current law requires the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to promulgate rules containing uniform statewide standards for the reclamation of nonmetallic mining sites. DNR is in the process of promulgating the rules. Nonmetallic mining is the extraction from the earth of substances such as stone, sand and gravel. Counties are required, and cities, villages and towns are authorized, to administer a nonmetallic mining reclamation program that includes permit requirements, requirements for public notice and an opportunity for a public informational hearing before issuance of a permit, requirements for reclamation plans and requirements for proof of financial responsibility for reclaiming nonmetallic mining sites. Nonmetallic mining that is conducted to obtain materials for the construction of a state-funded transportation facility is exempt from DNR requirements and a local government nonmetallic mining ordinance if the nonmetallic mining is subject to the requirements of the Department of Transportation concerning the restoration of the nonmetallic mining site.

The motion would incorporate the provisions of 1999 LRB-2397/1 to exempt nonmetallic mining conducted to obtain materials for certain local transportation projects from nonmetallic mining reclamation program requirements related to public notice, hearing, relamation plans and proof of financial responsibility.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires the department of natural resources (DNR) to promulgate rules containing uniform statewide standards for the reclamation of nonmetallic mining sites. Nonmetallic mining is the extraction from the earth of substances such as stone, sand and gravel. Current law requires counties, and authorizes cities, villages and towns, to administer a nonmetallic mining reclamation program that includes permit requirements, requirements for public notice and an opportunity for a public informational hearing before issuance of a permit, requirements for reclamation plans and requirements for proof of financial responsibility for reclaiming nonmetallic mining sites. Current law also provides some exemptions from DNR and local governmental requirements, including an exemption from DNR and local governmental requirements for nonmetallic mining conducted to obtain materials for construction of a transportation facility if the nonmetallic mining is subject to the requirements of the department of transportation (DOT) concerning the restoration of the nonmetallic mining site.

This bill exempts nonmetallic mining conducted to obtain materials for construction of a transportation facility from the requirements for a reclamation plan, for public notice and an opportunity for a public informational hearing and for proof of financial responsibility if the nonmetallic mining is conducted under
