MA HMO Childhood Lead Screening Requirements

Motion:

Move to require DHFS to include a lead screening performance standard with financial penalties in the MA HMO contract that begins January 1, 2000. Specify that MA HMOs would be required to provide at least one lead blood test to 65% of children between the ages of one and five who are enrolled in the HMO for the reporting period. Specify that the standard would only apply to children who have been enrolled in the HMO for at least six months of the reporting year.

Note:

Under this motion, the MA HMOs contract would include a requirement for blood lead screening tests for children between the ages of one and five, beginning January 1, 2000. The current HMO contract requires MA HMOs to develop and implement a program to ensure that 65% of MA enrollees with a first or second birthday during the reporting period had at least one blood lead test prior to their first or second birthday. This objective is limited to children who have been enrolled in the HMO for at least six months of the reporting year. This requirement is an objective, rather than a performance standard, and there are no financial penalties if HMOs do not meet this objective.

Under the current MA HMO contract, HMOs are required to provide a specified number of HealthCheck screens to children. If an HMO fails to meet HealthCheck screening rates that are identified in the HMO contract, DHFS would penalize the HMO by recouping MA payments from the HMO.

3 “SECTION 1424m. 49.45 (22) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 49.45 (22) MEDICAL ASSISTANCE SERVICES PROVIDED BY HEALTH MAINTENANCE  
5 ORGANIZATIONS. If the department contracts with health maintenance organizations  
6 for the provision of medical assistance it shall give special consideration to health  
7 maintenance organizations that provide or that contract to provide comprehensive,  
8 specialized health care services to pregnant teenagers. If the department contracts  
9 with health maintenance organizations for the provision of medical assistance, the  
10 department shall include in the contract a lead screening performance standard that  
11 requires the health maintenance organization to provide at least one lead blood test  
12 to at least 65% percent of the children ages ~~one~~ to 5 years who have been enrolled in
