Joint Finance met yesterday and acted on the Agency Services and General Statutory provision sections of DOA. In general it went quickly because most of DOA's legislative proposals were voted down. Below are the items for which I will need budget drafts. I understand from Tony M. that if the proposal is current law we simply need to reverselyank the LRB drafts. As you will see that is a common theme for DOA.

Agency Services

- 1. Consolidation of Appropriations (Paper 145 -- LRB 1781/3). The Committee chose alternative 2 which is current law.
- 2. Consolidation of State Vehicle Management Functions (Paper 149 LRB/1891/1). The Committee chose Alternatives 2 & 3. Alternative 2 deletes the Governor's consolidation language and replaces it with a session law requirement to study the possible consolidation of the three fleets, estimate the savings, and submit the results and suggested legislation to the Joint Finance Committee when the study is completed. Alt 3 includes session law direction the UW Board of Regents to cooperate with DOA on the study. All motions on this paper falled.
- 3. Report on Multi State Electronic Procurement Activities (Motion 435 no LRB draft). This motion requires DOA to submit a report by December 31, 1999. I will fax the motion.
- 4. <u>Federal Surplus Property Program.</u> (Motion 979 -- no LRB draft) This motion create an annual appropriation and provides \$100,000 GPR for DOA to pay as a grant to the non-profit operator of the federal surplus property program. I will fax you the motion.

General Statutory Provisions

- 1. <u>Authority to transfer Positions within DOA without Legislative Approval</u> (Paper 180 -: LRB/1679/3) Alternative 2 Maintain current law.
- 2. <u>Expansion of the Master lease program</u> (Paper 181 LRB/1495/4). The Committee chose to make all of the changes to the master lease but not expand the program to municipalities. I wrote the paper separating the expansion to municipalities from the other changes. So I believe we simply need to eliminate all of the municality references in LRB 1495/4.

Note: The use of master lease for energy construction projects will remain in the bill. This issue was not addressed but because DOA is a bill agency the Governor's recommendation is retained absent action.

- 3. Exemption from buying from work centers for the severely handicapped, (Paper 182 -- LRB/0362/2) Maintain current law.
- 4. Budget Request submittal date. (Paper 183 -- LRB 1139/2) Maintain current law.

Report on Multi-state Electronic Procurement Activities

Motion:

Move to include a session law provision to require the Department of Administration to provide a report to the Joint Finance Committee, before December 31, 1999, on the operation of multi-state electronic procurement systems. Provide that the report shall address at least all of the following issues: (1) the current status of multi-state electronic procurement systems available for potential use by the state; (2) estimated costs and benefits of Wisconsin use of a multi-state electronic procurement systems; and (3) funding and statutory change that would be required for Wisconsin participation in such a system.

Note:

This motion would require DOA to provide the Committee with a report by the end of this year on the feasibility of Wisconsin's use of a multi-state electronic procurement system. There is growing use of the Internet for purchasing. For example, there is an Internet site called the Multi-State EMall which is currently used by five states, on a pilot project basis, as a procurement tool. This report would provide the Committee with information on other states' efforts in this area and an estimate of the costs and benefits of Wisconsin participation in such a system.


