Unified Program Eligibility

Motion:

Move to require the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to coordinate with the Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS) and the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to develop a proposal and implementation plan for a simplified and unified application process for low-income families applying for medical assistance, BadgerCare, food stamps, reduced and free school lunches and the supplemental food program for women, infants and children (WIC). Further, require DWD, DHFS, and DPI to submit a joint plan to the Joint Committee on Finance under the 14-day passive approval process prior to implementing a new application process for these programs.

Note:

Under this motion, DWD in consultation with DPI and DHFS would be required to develop a plan for a simplified and unified application process for public assistance programs for low-income families. Development of such a plan may require: (a) data analysis; (b) consultation with staff who currently operate these programs and the recipients of these programs; and (c) preparation of proposals, issue papers and waiver requests from federal requirements. Prior to implementing a plan for a simplified and unified application process, DWD along with DHFS and DPI would have to submit a plan to the Joint Committee on Finance under the 14-day passive approval process.

days after receiving the proposal, the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the departments that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposal and implementation plan, the departments shall implement the proposal in accordance with the implementation plan. If, within 14 days after receiving the proposal and implementation plan, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the departments that a meeting has been scheduled for the purpose of reviewing the proposal and implementation plan, the departments may not implement the proposal except as approved by the committee.".
