Move to provide \$100,000 GPR annually in a new, annual appropriation within the Arts Board for a grant to the High Point Fund.

---

**Note:**

This motion would provide \$100,000 GPR annually in a new, annual appropriation within the Arts Board for a grant to the High Point Fund. The High Point Fund is a part of the Milwaukee Foundation, Inc. High Point consists of five arts organizations: African American Children's Theatre; City Ballet Theatre; Hansberry-Sands Theatre Company; Ko-Thi Dance Company; and the Milwaukee Repertory Theatre. The goal of High Point is to raise a \$200,000 endowment for African American performing artists by December, 2000. The income from the Fund would then be used to provide an annual stipend to each organization. The stipend would be designated for performing artists, choreographers, directors, costume designers and theatre technicians.

How many grants does the Foundation make each year?

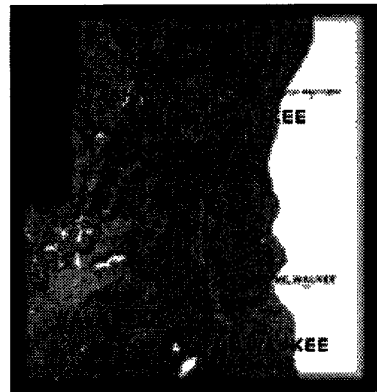
Grants totaling \$10 million went to more than 600 local organizations in 1998.
