This change would reduce by one year the period the fee would be increased, but increase the amount of the fee increase recommended by the Joint Committee on Finance from \$1.40 to \$2.00 for this period.~~

15. *Poison Control Center Staff Qualifications.* Modify JFC provisions relating to poison control centers by authorizing a person who is designated as a poison information provider, who annually receives at least 16 hours of job-relevant continuing education and has an appropriate health-oriented background to interpret poison exposure data and provide poison intervention and management information directly.

Under the substitute amendment, an on-line staff member who is designated as a poison information provider could, if he or she annually receives at least 16 documented hours of job-relevant continuing education and has an appropriate health-oriented background, provide poison information to manage nontoxic exposures and routine follow-up. In addition, an on-line staff member who is designated as a poison information provider would triage incoming telephone calls concerning toxic exposures and, for health care professionals, concerning drug interaction interpretations, and refer such calls to an on-duty staff member.

16. *State Treasurer.* Restore the provision that would revise the current definition of "intangible property" subject to the provisions of the Unclaimed Property Act (Chapter 177 of the statutes) to specifically exclude a credit balance issued to a commercial customer account by a business association in the ordinary course of business. This exclusion would not apply to commercial credit balances deemed to be demand, savings or matured time deposits, ownership shares or mutual investment certificates (including associated interest and dividends on any of the foregoing) that are deposited at a banking or financial institution. These provisions, which were recommended by the Governor and deleted by the Finance Committee, would first apply to unclaimed property received by the State Treasurer after the general effective date of the biennial budget act.

Under current law, certain types of intangible property are presumed abandoned under the state's Unclaimed Property Act unless the owner of the property takes steps to show ownership within specified periods of time (ranging from five to 15 years, depending on the type of intangible property). When the property is deemed abandoned, the holder of the property must report and deliver it to the State Treasurer. As a result of the proposed change, a vendor that had issued a credit balance on a commercial account would no longer have to report and deliver to the State Treasurer an abandoned sales credit.

4 **146.57 (title) Statewide poison control ~~program~~ system.**

5 **SECTION 2251e.** 146.57 (1m) of the statutes is created to read:

6 **146.57 (1m) DEFINITIONS.** In this section:

7 (a) “Appropriate health-oriented background” means one of the following:

8 1. Licensure as an emergency medical technician — basic, emergency medical  
9 technician — intermediate or emergency medical technician — paramedic under s.  
10 146.50 (5) (a).

11 2. Licensure as a licensed practical nurse under s. 441.10 (3).

12 3. Completion of a training program directed by a physician specializing in  
13 toxicology and, as determined by the medical director of a poison control center,

1 background sufficient to understand and interpret standard poison information  
2 resources and to transmit that information understandably to both health  
3 professionals and the public under the direct supervision of a staff member specified  
4 under sub. (3m) (b) 1. to 7. or the medical director.

5 (b) “On-line staff member” means a member of the staff of a poison control  
6 center who personally responds to telephone inquiries received by the poison control  
7 center.

8 (c) “Pharmacist” has the meaning given in s. 450.01 (15).

9 (d) “Physician” has the meaning given in s. 448.01 (5).

10 (e) “Poison control services” means poison prevention education, and rapid and  
11 accurate poison interpretation, poison intervention and management information.

12 (f) “Registered nurse” means a nurse who is licensed under s. 441.06.

13 (g) “School of pharmacy” means a school of pharmacy that is accredited by the  
14 American Council on Pharmaceutical Education.

15 **SECTION 2251f.** 146.57 (3) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

16 146.57 (3) (a) The department shall implement a statewide poison control  
17 program system, which shall provide poison control services that are available  
18 statewide, on a 24-hour per day and 365-day per year basis and shall provide poison  
19 information and education to health care professionals and the public. From the  
20 appropriation under s. 20.435 (5) (ds), the department shall, if the requirement  
21 under par. (b) is met, distribute total funding of not more than \$375,000 in each fiscal  
22 year to supplement the operation of the program system and to provide for the  
23 statewide collection and reporting of poison control data. The department may, but  
24 need not, distribute all of the funds in each fiscal year to a single poison control  
25 center.

1           **SECTION 2251g.** 146.57 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:

2           **146.57 (3m) REQUIREMENTS OF POISON CONTROL CENTERS.** (a) A poison control  
3 center shall maintain telephone services capable of providing rapid, accurate and  
4 complete poison information that is accessible throughout the state and that is free  
5 to users through a statewide toll-free hotline.

6           (b) An on-line staff member who interprets poison exposure data and provides  
7 poison intervention and management information shall be one of the following:

8           1. A registered nurse.

9           2. A pharmacist.

10          3. A physician.

11          4. A person who is certified by or eligible for certification by the American  
12 Association of Poison Control Centers as a specialist in poison information.

13          5. A school of pharmacy graduate who is in residency training.

14          6. A school of pharmacy enrollee who has completed the 2nd professional  
15 practice year.

16          7. A person who was employed as an on-line staff member on May 1, 1994, who  
17 has worked in that capacity at the poison control center for at least 3 years and who  
18 annually receives at least 16 documented hours of continuing education in  
19 interpreting poison exposure data and providing poison intervention and  
20 management information.

21          8. An person who is designated as a poison information provider, annually  
22 receives at least 16 documented hours of job-relevant continuing education and has  
23 an appropriate health-oriented background.”.
