At your request, I am providing information relating to a proposal to provide state bonding to assist in building additional classrooms as needed to implement a statewide expansion of the Student Achievement Guarantee in Education (SAGE) program.

Under this proposal, \$200 million of general fund supported, state general obligation bonding would be provided. This bonding could be used by school districts to build additional classroom facilities, as needed, in order to participate in a proposed statewide expansion of the SAGE program. This SAGE expansion proposal is summarized in a memorandum from this office to you dated June 17, 1999.

In order to receive funding from this proposed bonding, school districts would be required to apply to the Department of Public Instruction (DPI). School districts would have to apply by January 1 of each year. DPI would review these applications to determine whether the proposed school addition would be required, and to approve, modify or reject the request. DPI would have until April 1 to notify schools of the amount, if any, of funding that they would be eligible for under this program. In this application to DPI, school districts would have to provide information to allow the Department to determine whether additional space would be needed and the cost of the proposed additional space. DPI would be required to promulgate administrative rules to establish what information school districts would have to submit to DPI to apply for funding under this program and the procedures DPI will use to review, approve, modify or reject requests.

The amount of bonding that school districts would receive under the program would vary depending on the amount of their funding request and the percentage of equalization aid as a percentage of shared costs that the school district received in that aid year. This percentage would be applied to the amount of project costs that DPI determined to be needed for school expansion

under the school district application process. As an example, if DPI determined that a school district that applied in 1999-00 needed \$10 million of funding, and that it received equalization aid in 1999-00 equal to 80% of its 1998-99 shared costs, then that school district would qualify for \$8 million in aid, funded from the proceeds of state general obligation bonds. The school district could pay for the remainder of the project costs from its own revenues, including revenues derived from the property tax levy and state aid or through the issuance of its own bonds after referenda approval.

If the amount of funding applications approved by DPI would exceed the amount of state bonding still available in that year, then DPI would be required to prorate each of the funding amounts approved proportionately.

For purposes of two-thirds funding of partial school revenues, the proposal would count the GPR debt service paid on the general obligation bonds issued to fund this program as part of state two-thirds funding. Assuming that this bonding is issued in the fall of 2000, debt service would increase by an estimated \$5,500,000 GPR in 2000-01. In order to adjust state two-thirds funding of partial school revenues, \$1,833,300 GPR of funding for equalization aids would be deleted in 2000-01. As a result, the net cost in 2000-01 would be an estimated \$3,666,700 GPR. Beginning in 2001-02, annual debt service would be an estimated \$16.7 million, assuming the bonds would be issued with a 20-year, level payment structure.

Finally, to address the additional workload for DPI associated with the statewide expansion of the SAGE and related bonding programs, \$112,800 GPR in 1999-00 and \$131,400 GPR in 2000-01 and 2.0 GPR positions beginning in 1999-00 would be provided.






