AN ACT *Sen. Cat.*; relating to: the joint committee on information policy.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill changes the name of the joint committee on information policy to the joint committee on information policy and technology.

The joint committee consists of the assembly cochairperson of the joint committee on finance, or a member of that committee who is designated by its assembly cochairperson; the senate cochairperson of the joint committee on finance, or a member of that committee who is designated by its senate cochairperson; and two other majority party and ~~two~~^{two} minority party senators and ~~two~~^{two} other majority and ~~two~~^{two} minority party representatives to the assembly, appointed as are the members of standing committees in their respective houses. This bill deletes the requirement that two members of the joint committee on finance be members and requires that three, rather than two, members in each house be from the majority party.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:




