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**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 187**

February 22, 2000 – Offered by Representative POWERS.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 16.72 (2) (b); and **to create** 13.94 (1) (q), 15.105 (26), 16.25,
2 16.705 (1m), 16.71 (5), 20.505 (4) (ec) and 20.505 (4) (er) of the statutes;
3 **relating to:** establishing a service award program for volunteer fire fighters
4 and emergency medical technicians, creating a volunteer fire fighter and
5 emergency medical technician service award board, requiring the exercise of
6 rule-making authority and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

7 **SECTION 1.** 13.94 (1) (q) of the statutes is created to read:
8 13.94 (1) (q) No later than February 1, 2006, prepare a performance evaluation
9 audit of the volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical technician service award
10 program established under s. 16.25. The legislative audit bureau shall file a copy of
11 the audit report under this paragraph with the distributees specified in par. (b).

1 **SECTION 2.** 15.105 (26) of the statutes is created to read:

2 **15.105 (26) VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTER AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN**
3 SERVICE AWARD BOARD. (a) There is created a volunteer fire fighter and emergency
4 medical technician service award board that is attached to the department of
5 administration under s. 15.03. The board shall consist of the secretary of
6 administration or his or her designee and the following members appointed for
7 3-year terms:

8 1. One member who is volunteer fire fighter and who is a member of a statewide
9 organization that represents fire chiefs.

10 2. One member who is volunteer fire fighter and who is a member of a statewide
11 organization that represents volunteer fire fighters.

12 3. One member who is a volunteer emergency medical technician

13 4. Three members who represent municipalities that operate volunteer fire
14 departments or that contract with volunteer fire companies organized under ch. 181
15 or 213.

16 (b) In appointing the members under par. (a), the governor shall seek to appoint
17 members from different regions of the state and from municipalities of different
18 sizes.

19 **SECTION 3.** 16.25 of the statutes is created to read:

20 **16.25 Volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical technician service**
21 **award program.** (1) In this section:

22 (a) "Board" means the volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical technician
23 service award board.

24 (b) "Internal Revenue Code" means the Internal Revenue Code, as defined for
25 the current taxable year under s. 71.01 (6).

1 (c) “Municipality” means a city, village or town.

2 (d) “Program” means the volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical
3 technician service award program established under sub. (2).

4 (2) The board shall establish by rule a program to provide length-of-service
5 awards, described in 26 USC 457 (e) (11), to volunteer fire fighters in municipalities
6 that operate volunteer fire departments or that contract with volunteer fire
7 companies organized under ch. 181 or 213 and to volunteer emergency medical
8 technicians in any municipality that authorizes volunteer emergency medical
9 technicians to provide emergency medical technical services in the municipality. To
10 the extent permitted by federal law, the board shall design the program so as to treat
11 the length-of-service awards as a tax-deferred benefit under the Internal Revenue
12 Code.

13 (3) The board shall promulgate rules to include the following design features
14 for the program:

15 (a) All municipalities that operate volunteer fire departments or that contract
16 with a volunteer fire company organized under ch. 181 or 213 and all municipalities
17 that authorize volunteer emergency medical technicians to provide emergency
18 medical technical services are eligible to participate in the program.

19 (b) Annual contributions in an amount determined by the municipality shall
20 be paid by each municipality for each volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical
21 technician who provides services for the municipality.

22 (c) The municipality may select from among the plans offered by individuals
23 or organizations under contract with the board under sub. (4) for the volunteer fire
24 fighters and emergency medical technicians who perform services for the

6 volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical technician service award board under
7 s. 16.25 (4) (b).

8 **SECTION 5.** 16.71 (5) of the statutes is created to read:

9 **16.71 (5)** The department shall delegate authority to the volunteer fire fighter
10 and emergency medical technician service award board to enter into contracts under
11 s. 16.25 (4) (b).

12 **SECTION 6.** 16.72 (2) (b) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
13 amended to read:

14 **16.72 (2) (b)** Except as provided in ss. 16.25 (4) (b), 16.751 and 565.25 (2) (a)
15 4., the department shall prepare or review specifications for all materials, supplies,
16 equipment, other permanent personal property and contractual services not
17 purchased under standard specifications. Such “nonstandard specifications” may be
18 generic or performance specifications, or both, prepared to describe in detail the
19 article which the state desires to purchase either by its physical properties or
20 programmatic utility. When appropriate for such nonstandard items or services,

13 from the appropriation under section 20.505 (4) (ec) of the statutes, as created by this
14 act, for the period ending on June 30, 2001, for the purpose of establishing the
15 volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical technician service award program
16 under section 16.25 of the statutes, as created by this act.

17 (3) RULES FOR VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTER AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN
18 SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM. Using the procedure under section 227.24 of the statutes,
19 the volunteer fire fighter and emergency medical technician service award board
20 may promulgate rules required under section 16.25 of the statutes, as created by this
21 act, for the period before permanent rules become effective, but not to exceed the
22 period authorized under section 227.24 (1) (c) and (2) of the statutes.
23 Notwithstanding section 227.24 (1) (a), (2) (b) and (3) of the statutes, the board is not
24 required to provide evidence that promulgating a rule under this subsection as an
25 emergency rule is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety

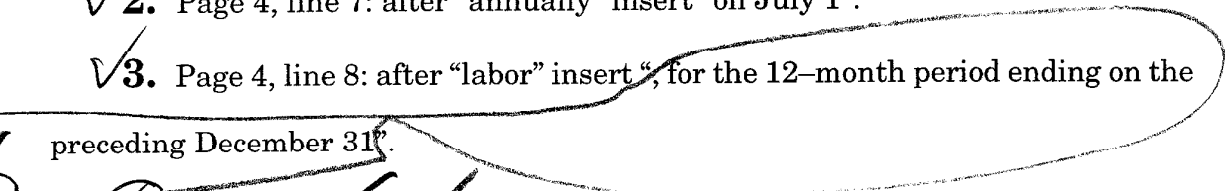
