Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law prohibits the manufacture, commercial transfer or possession, with the intent to transfer commercially, of a device designed exclusively for gambling purposes. This bill allows the commercial transfer and possession of slot machines manufactured prior to December 31, 1974, and used solely for display, restoration or preservation purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 SECTION 1. 945.05 (1) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

5 945.05 (1) (b) Any device which he or she knows is designed exclusively for
6 gambling purposes or anything which he or she knows is designed exclusively as a
7 subassembly or essential part of such device. This includes without limitation
8 gambling machines, numbers jars, punch boards and roulette wheels. Playing cards,

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1,
TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 273

November 23, 1999 - Offered by COMMITTEE ON STATE AFFAIRS.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 1. Page 1, line 2: after "possession" insert ", in certain places,".

3 2. Page 1, line 3: after "purposes" insert "and providing a penalty".

4 3. Page 1, line 4: delete that line and substitute:

5 "SECTION 1g. 945.035 of the statutes is created to read:

6 **945.035 Certain slot machines on licensed premises.** (1) In this section,
7 "exempt slot machine" means a slot machine manufactured before December 31,
8 1974, that is exempt from the prohibition under s. 945.05 (1) because it is intended
9 to be used solely for display, restoration and preservation purposes.

10 (2) No person to whom a license or permit has been issued under ch. 125 may
11 do any of the following:

12 (a) Set up or keep an exempt slot machine on the premises for which the license
13 or permit is issued.

1 (b) Permit another person to set up or keep an exempt slot machine on the
