Honorable Mr. Brandemuehl:

I am as concerned as you are with the situation surrounding military funeral and burial honors for veterans. We in the Wisconsin National Guard are quite aware of the problem among our own retiree community, especially our WWII 32d Division members who are reaching their 70s and 80s. Up to this point, we have primarily been relying on the generosity of our own Guard members in giving of their free time voluntarily and at no cost to handle the requests that have been received. We, too, would like to do something different.

However, we have some severe limitations. First, there is no provision for non-emergency state active duty in chapter 21 of the Statutes, only for gubernatorial declared emergencies in Section 21.11. Thus, even if there were funds made available without additional statutory authority to put a soldier or airman in a state duty status, we could not pay them. Second, on the federal side we do not, on the Army Guard side, have blanket authority to pay our soldiers to perform duties at funeral or burial services unless it is one of our Active Guard or Reserve (AGR) members funerals. This is because we are primarily authorized federal funds for training related to our soldier's military occupational specialty, or soldier common tasks and this type of training does not include funeral or burial ceremonies. The Air Guard is, however, authorized to handle some funeral and burial services for Air Force and Air National Guard veterans while in a duty status through their Color Guard detachment.

It would appear that it is, however, in the best interests of the State and our veteran community to have some type of plan in place to help with funerals or burial ceremonies of our veterans. I would strongly recommend that the more appropriate state Department to handle this is probably the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs. If a fund is set up to pay local veterans organizations a fee for appearing at funerals and burial ceremonies as in Missouri, someone would have to administer it and handle the scheduling of the groups or at least formally authorizing the funeral homes to make the arrangements. The Department of Veteran Affairs has a close association with the veterans organizations throughout the state. Perhaps they might be a better choice to be in charge of this program.

If we can be of further assistance, please let us know.

Start-up costs of \$125,000 for the Military Honors Detail are based upon staffing the above mentioned positions with their accompanying salary, fringe, supplies and services, one-time start-up costs for such positions and all other associated overhead costs (e.g. State owned vehicle lease charges, office space rental, etc.). These costs are based upon current figures that may change due to salary and fringe increases resulting from the signing of the 1999 – 2001 Budget.

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For this draft, I have included an appropriation but have specified "\$-0-" for expenditure in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01. The department of veteran affairs provided me with the estimated costs of the two staffneeded to administer the program (\$125,000 annually), but no estimate as to the amount needed for payments to the local veteran groups. When you know the dollar amounts that you need to include in the proposal, contact me and I will either redraft the proposal or draft an amendment, whichever is appropriate.

Please note, however, that s. 16.47(2), stats., states that neither house may pass any bill containing an appropriation, increasing the cost of state government or decreasing state revenues by more than \$10,000 annually until both houses pass the executive budget bill, except that the governor or joint committee on finance or, under certain circumstances, the committee on organization of either house may enact emergency appropriation bills prior to the passage of the executive budget bill.
