

DEFINE PROBLEM PRECISELY

A few registration types have statutorily specified expiration date. These dates were placed in statute many years ago, when most work was manual and we were unable to balance our workload without specifying dates in statute.

With the exception of quarterly registration (S.341.30(2)), DMV would like to eliminate statutory specification of the expiration date. We would then be able to set expiration dates by policy. We propose to maintain current expiration dates, but we would have the ability to set or change dates if we ever need to, without changing statutes, to better manage workload. We have been able during the last few legislative sessions to eliminate most specific expiration dates. A few remain, however, and we would like to eliminate these specific dates.

PROPOSED SOLUTION

Amend S.341.25(1)(b) and S.341.297(1) to make motorcycles and moped registrations expire biennially in even-numbered years, but not specify April 30. Amend S. 341.26(2) intro to specify that registration under this subsection expires every fifth year on a date to be determined by the DOT. Amend S.341.26(3)(a)1. and S.341.297(2) to make farm trucks of 12,000 pounds and under expire biennially in even-numbered years.

LEGISLATIVE BACKGROUND

Previously, we have obtained repeal of several specific expiration dates.
