SUMMARY OF BILL - This bill requires that the Department promulgate rules to regulate wetlands mitigation and requires that the Department initiate negotiations with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers (ACE) to establish guidelines for wetlands mitigation projects and banking. Under the bill, a wetland mitigation project is one that restores, enhances or creates a wetland to compensate for adverse impacts to other wetlands or that uses credits from a "wetlands mitigation bank"--that is, a system of accounting for wetland loss and compensation that includes one or more sites where wetlands are restored, enhanced or created to provide transferable credits to be subsequently applied to compensate for adverse impacts to other wetlands. The bill allows the Department to consider wetland mitigation in determining whether to grant a permit or other approval for an activity that will have an adverse effect on the wetland.

FISCAL IMPACT - The bill directs the Department to promulgate rules to regulate wetlands mitigation projects and negotiate with the ACE to establish guidelines for mitigation projects and banking. The one-time costs associated with this will be absorbed in the Department's current budget. It is likely that there may be additional fiscal effects on the Department associated with implementing a wetlands mitigation program. However, those potential costs cannot be reliably estimated until the Department has proceeded with the rulemaking and negotiations required by this bill.
