Rep. Schooff would like the following changes made to the ASA.

- ✓ 1. Leave as a full grant however, if the applicant is a sole proprietor or spouse or child of owner then make it an 80/20 grant: 80% paid by state, 20% by business.
- ✓ 2. Add to criteria for preference: A. Inclusion in Enterprise/Community Development Zone, and B. Businesses adversely affected by federal mandates or policies.
- ✓ 3. Please clarify that the grant can not be used to pay for wages or lost revenue. Tuition and training costs only
- ✓ 4. The business must be in good standing with the Department of Revenue in filling & payment of sales and use taxes for at least 6 months prior to application.
- ✓ 5. Change the limit on employees from 35 to 25.
- ✓ 6. The Department reports back to the legislature no later than 6 months.

TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 471

1 AN ACT to amend 20.143 (1) (c); and to create 560.155 of the statutes; relating
2 to: providing grants to small businesses for training employes and making an
3 appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 SECTION 1. 20.143 (1) (c) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9,
5 is amended to read:

6 20.143 (1) (c) *Wisconsin development fund; grants, loans, reimbursements and*
7 *assistance.* Biennially, the amounts in the schedule for grants under ss. 560.145,
8 560.155, 560.16, 560.175, 560.26; for grants and loans under ss. 560.62, 560.63 and
9 560.66; for loans under s. 560.147; for reimbursements under s. 560.167; for
10 providing assistance under s. 560.06; for the costs specified in s. 560.607; for the loan
11 under 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, section 9110 (4); and for the grants under 1995
12 Wisconsin Act 27, section 9116 (7gg), 1995 Wisconsin Act 119, section 2 (1), 1997

1 (2) (a) The department may not award a business more than \$10,000 in grants
2 under this section.

3 (b) In awarding grants under this section, the department shall give preference
4 to businesses in industries with especially severe labor shortages.

5 (c) The department may not award more than \$500,000 in grants under this
6 section in fiscal year 2000-01.

7 (3) A business that receives a grant under this section shall submit to the
8 department, within 6 months after spending the full amount of the proceeds, a report
9 detailing how the ^{grant} proceeds were used.

10 **SECTION 3. Effective date.**

11 (1) This act takes effect on July 1, 2000.

14 compensate for lost revenue, if any, in connection with providing the training or other
15 education, or otherwise.
