Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with certain exceptions, a person must be certified by the medical examining board (examining board) in the department of regulation and licensing (DORL) in order to practice as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant or to designate himself or herself as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant.

This bill creates a five-member occupational therapists affiliated credentialing board (affiliated credentialing board) in DORL consisting of two occupational therapists, one occupational therapy assistant and two public members, and transfers to the affiliated credentialing board all authority that the examining board has under current law relating to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants. In addition, the bill requires the affiliated credentialing board to license, rather than certify, persons to practice as occupational therapists or occupational therapy assistants. The bill also does all of the following:

1. To qualify for certification under current law, a person must meet educational and other requirements, including a) being certified as either an occupational therapist or an occupational therapy assistant by the American occupational therapy certification board; and b) being found qualified by three-fourths of the members of the examining board. The bill retains the educational requirements that a person must satisfy for a license, but requires a person to be certified as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, rather than by the American occupational therapy certification board. In addition, the bill does not require three-fourths of the affiliated credentialing board to find that an applicant is qualified.

2. Under current law, a health care practitioner licensed or certified by the examining board, including an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant, must register with the examining board every two years, meet continuing education requirements, pay a license or certificate renewal fee and display a certificate of registration in his or her office at all times. Registration with the examining board is deemed to satisfy any statutory requirement to renew a license or certificate. The bill eliminates these requirements. Instead, an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant must renew his or her license every two years by submitting a renewal form to DORL, accompanied by a renewal fee and a statement attesting that the occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant has complied with continuing education requirements promulgated by rule by the affiliated credentialing board.

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1 (2) Examinations under sub. (1) may consist of written or oral tests, or both,

5 under s. 440.08 (2) (a). Renewal applications shall be submitted to the department
6 on a form provided by the department and shall include the renewal fee specified in
7 s. 440.08 (2) (a) and a statement attesting compliance with the continuing education
8 requirements established in rules promulgated under s. 448.965 (1) (b).

9 **448.968 Disciplinary proceedings and actions.** (1) Subject to the rules
10 promulgated under s. 440.03 (1), the affiliated credentialing board may make
11 investigations and conduct hearings to determine whether a violation of this
12 subchapter or any rule promulgated under this subchapter has occurred.

13 (2) Subject to the rules promulgated under s. 440.03 (1), the affiliated
14 credentialing board may reprimand a licensee or deny, limit, suspend or revoke a
15 license granted under this subchapter if it finds that the applicant or licensee has
16 done any of the following:

17 (a) Made a material misstatement in an application for a license or for renewal
18 of a license.

19 (b) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, been convicted of an offense the
20 circumstances of which substantially relate to the practice of occupational therapy
21 or assisting in the practice of occupational therapy.

22 (c) Advertised in a manner that is false, deceptive or misleading.

23 (d) Advertised, practiced or attempted to practice under another's name.

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1 (e) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.34, practiced occupational therapy
2 or assisted in the practice of occupational therapy while his or her ability to practice
3 was impaired by alcohol or other drugs.

4 (f) Engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct in violation of the code of
5 ethics established in the rules promulgated under s. 448.965 (1) (c).

6 (g) Engaged in conduct while practicing occupational therapy or assisting in
7 the practice of occupational therapy that evidences a lack of knowledge or ability to
8 apply professional principles or skills.

9 (h) Violated this subchapter or any rule promulgated under this subchapter.

10 **448.969 Injunctive relief.** If the affiliated credentialing board has reason to
11 believe that any person is violating this subchapter or any rule promulgated under
12 this subchapter, the affiliated credentialing board, the department, the attorney
13 general or the district attorney of the proper county may investigate and may, in
14 addition to any other remedies, bring an action in the name and on behalf of this state
15 to enjoin the person from the violation.

16 **448.970 Penalties; appeal.** (1) A person who violates any provision of this
17 subchapter may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than 9

13 **SECTION 59. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the first day of the 7th
14 month after publication, except as follows:

15 (1) The treatment of sections 15.08 (1m) (b), 15.085 (1m) (b) and 15.406 (5) of
16 the statutes and SECTION 58 of this act take effect on the day after publication.
