Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill requires a school board to permit a pupil enrolled in a home-based private educational program to participate fully in any extracurricular or recreational school program or activity if the pupil is enrolled in the home-based private educational program at the beginning of the school term, the pupil resides in the attendance area served by the school sponsoring the extracurricular or recreational school program or activity and the school board determines that there is sufficient space in the program or activity.

This bill permits a school board to transport pupils enrolled in a home-based private educational program and their parents or guardians to an extracurricular activity and permits the school board to charge the persons transported for the cost of providing the transportation.

State Fiscal Effect

None.

Local Fiscal Effect

The costs of providing such programs vary across districts and the number of home-schooled children that would participate in each district cannot be predicted. The costs are indeterminable. To the extent that costs are incurred in a year and the costs are not exempted from revenue limits, a district will have to reduce other costs to offset any cost increases resulting from this bill.
