Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill would increase a school district's revenue limit for the 1999-2000 and 2000-2001 school years by the amount equal to the amount spent by the school district in the previous year to prevent the failure or to correct the failure of an electronic computing device that is under the control of the school district to recognize, process, distinguish, or interpret the year 2000 or a subsequent year or the failure of an electronic computing device to produce, generate or calculate a correct date if the year 2000 or a subsequent year is a part of that date.

Currently, no specific information pertaining to potential Y2K computer problems or remedies in the state's 426 school districts is collected by the Department of Public Instruction. Therefore the fiscal effects of this bill are indeterminable.

However, this bill could increase partial school revenue and, therefore, require a significant increase in state aid and the school tax levy credit in order to maintain the 2/3 commitment.
