Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill eliminates current law pertaining to an implied warranty that relates to paratuberculosis (Johne's disease) in the sale of an animal and creates implied warranty provisions that will be applicable for specific diseases as they pertain to specific animals, both identified by DATCP, and for which DATCP determines disease management classification systems, effective 7/1/2000.

DATCP presently assigns classifications for Johne's disease tested herds. This change in statutory law expands DATCP's authority by rule to identify the diseases and the types of animals that should be covered under an implied warranty law relating to these diseases and allows DATCP to determine management classification systems for these diseases in these animals. There is no state fiscal effect.

When DATCP identifies by rule a disease, types of animals affected and a corresponding management classification system, DATCP will prepare a fiscal estimate to reflect the fiscal impact on DATCP of this particular program.
