

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate		
<p>The number of persons subject to this bill would generally be very small as most persons convicted of their first first-degree intentional homicide are given very long prison sentences. However, while they are in prison, there is the possibility that they may commit a first-degree intentional homicide against another prisoner or prison staff. Thus the workload implication of this bill for district attorneys is focused on those DA offices serving counties with state prisons which house such offenders, rather than on the Milwaukee County DA office which prosecutes most homicide cases in the state, are likely to be the most impacted by this bill. There are no clear data on the additional workload this bill would create. It is likely that homicides covered by this bill would be essentially a random occurrence for any DA office. If it occurred, then a special prosecutor from the Department of Justice or elsewhere might be sufficient additional help were any were needed at all.</p>		
Long-Range Fiscal Implications		
The actual workload impact on DA offices would need to be closely monitored so that if any additional permanent prosecutorial staff are needed, they can be quickly provided.
