Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This legislation extends eligibility to take promotional civil service examinations for classified positions in a first-class city (Milwaukee) to city employees currently holding unclassified positions, mainly employees appointed by the police and fire commission. Various political appointees are exempted from this group.

The legislation could slightly increase costs to administer examinations if the applicant pool for examinations increased dramatically. The amount of this possible increase cannot be determined, but Milwaukee estimates that 5 additional candidates might apply for any of approximately promotional opportunities a year. This remote possibility of increase would be off-set by the benefits of retaining experienced employees and providing career enhancement opportunities. Any possible increase in the cost of examination administration would also be offset by greater diversity in the candidate pool.
