

Good morning. Representative Huebsch and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify today. My name is Rolf Wegenke, and I am the president of the Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (WAICU). Our organization represents the 50,000 students attending the twenty-one private (or independent) colleges and universities in the state.

I want to begin by saying that Wisconsin's private colleges and universities value the privacy of students and are highly supportive of efforts to protect privacy. Every WAICU member complies with the federal privacy requirements imposed by the U.S. Department of Education under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). These privacy regulations impose stringent restrictions on the release of student information – both internally and externally to the campus. For example, FERPA even precludes student information other than student directory information from being shared with WAICU.

The 21 private colleges and universities oppose Assembly Bill 28 on the grounds that it is unnecessary. More than half of the private colleges and universities already assign students an identification number other than their Social Security number. The rest are either in the process of modifying their system or have plans to make such changes.

One of the issues raised as 1997 Wisconsin Act 128 (identical legislation for the UW, technical, and K-12 entities) was being considered was the fiscal impact on the institutions. Unlike the institutions which were addressed by Act 128, private colleges and universities receive no taxpayer support for operations. This legislation essentially creates an unfunded mandate on certain private, independent, institutions.

Again thank you for the opportunity to share my concerns with respect to AB 28.
