IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY AND MAKE MORE JUDGES
READILY AVAILABLE**

**FOR EXAMPLE, I AM THE ELECTED JUDGE FROM THE
CITY OF BROOKFIELD FOR 25 YEARS AND SO LONG AS I
AM A CURRENT SITTING JUDGE I CAN BE A
SUBSTITUTE IN MILWAUKEE MUNICIPAL COURT. BUT,
UNDER PRESENT LAW IF I RETIRE AND BECOME A
RESERVE JUDGE I CANNOT SIT IN ANOTHER DISTRICT
SUCH AS MILWAUKEE. UNDER THE SAME
CIRCUMSTANCES A RETIRED MILWAUKEE COUNTY
JUDGE FROM MUNICIPAL COURT CAN SIT IN**

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**MILWAUKEE BECAUSE IT IS THE SAME DISTRICT. THE

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AMENDMENT TO SEC 800.065(1)


THIS AMENDMENT WILL ALLOW THE CHIEF JUDGE OF A JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT TO APPOINT ANY ELIGIBLE PERSON TO ACT AS A TEMPORARY RESERVE JUDGE WITHIN THE JUDICIAL DISTRICT, REGARDLESS OF WHERE THE RESERVE JUDGE RESIDES AT THE TIME OF THE APPOINTMENT

FOR EXAMPLE, NOW MILWAUKEE MUNICIPAL COURT MAY APPOINT A CURRENT SITTING JUDGE FROM ANOTHER DISTRICT SUCH AS WAUKESHA COUNTY TO SUBSTITUTE IN MILWAUKEE MUNICIPAL COURT. HOWEVER, IF THAT SAME JUDGE RETIRES THAT JUDGE NO LONGER QUALIFIES TO BE A SUBSTITUTE JUDGE IN MILWAUKEE EVEN THOUGH AS A RETIRED JUDGE HE/SHE IS MORE READILY AVAILABLE AND HAS PRIOR EXPERIENCE FROM BEING A SUBSTITUTE JUDGE IN MILWAUKEE

ANOTHER EXAMPLE IS WHEN A RETIRED MUNICIPAL JUDGE SPENDS A SUMMER PERIOD IN NORTHERN WISCONSIN AND HAS THE OPPORTUNITY TO SUBSTITUTE FOR A MUNICIPAL JUDGE IN THAT LOCATION HE/SHE IS PROHIBITED FROM DOING SO EVEN THOUGH HE/SHE HAS THE TIME AND IS READILY AVAILABLE

THIS AMENDMENT WILL GIVE MORE FLEXIBILITY TO MUNICIPAL JUDGES TO SUBSTITUTE IN LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE STATE WHEN REQUESTED ON THEIR RETIREMENT
