1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 636 

January 11, 2000 - Introduced by Representative Schneider, cosponsored by Senator Erpenbach. Referred to Committee on Judiciary and Personal Privacy.

Pg1Ln1 **An Act** to create 971.19 (11) of the statutes; relating to: place of trial for persons  
Pg1Ln2 charged with certain crimes.

AB636 

Under current law, a defendant charged with a crime must generally be tried in the county in which the crime was committed. Current law also provides a number of counties in which a crime may be tried. For example, if a crime entails the commission of any of the following crimes, the crime may be tried in any county in which any of the acts

charged with any of the following crimes may be tried in the county of the defendant's residence, the victim's county of residence or in any county in which the crime may be held under current law: 1) defamation; 2) giving false information; 3) misappropriation of personal identifying information; 4) theft of trade secrets; 5) threats to communicate derogatory information; 6) threats to disclose confidential information; 7) computer crimes; 8) tampering with public use of telephone; and 9) unlawful use of electronic mail.
