Brandemuehl/Breske bills:

- 1. AB 54, relating to issuing dealer registration plates to motor vehicle salvage pools.
- 2. AB 55, relating to misuse of distinctive dealer registration plate by a motor vehicle dealer, distributor, transporter or manufacturer.
- 3. AB 56, relating to motor carriers and the single-state insurance registration system.
- 4. AB 57, relating to eligibility to operate commercial motor vehicles and the transport of hazardous materials.
- 5. AB 58, relating to administrative action against motor vehicle auction dealer's licenses.
- 6. AB 59, relating to motor vehicle registration expiration dates.
- 7. AB 136, relating to transferring appeals of certain determinations of the department of transportation from the division of hearing and appeals to the tax appeals commission.
- 8. AB 137, relating to older security interests in motor vehicles.
- 9. AB 206, relating to creating a permit authorizing the operation upon a highway of a specialized hauling rig that exceeds statutory size and weight limits.
