Dear Senator Burke, Representative Gard and Members:

This report is required by subsection (7) of 18.16 of the Wisconsin Statutes and specifies the reason for not complying with subsections (2) to (5) of the same section for a specific issue of debt.

On June 28, 2000, the Building Commission authorized the sale of \$35,000,000 State of Wisconsin General Obligation Bonds of 2000, Series B (Taxable) (the "Bonds"). Pursuant to this authorization, on July 12, 2000, the Capital Finance Director conducted a public sale for and awarded the Bonds. This was a public sale conducted pursuant to Subchapter I of Chapter 18. The attached Official Notice of Sale, dated July 3, 2000, set the terms and conditions of the sale and was available to all potential bidders. The State received six bids for the Bonds.

The award was based on the lowest true interest cost rate to the State. The successful underwriters were a syndicate managed by PaineWebber Incorporated. A list of the syndicate members is attached. There are no firms in the syndicate that are certified by the Department of Commerce as minority owned.

Underwriting participation by minority owned firms is encouraged. There is a section "Minority Participation" in the Official Notice of Sale and the attached list of the certified minority owned firms, including address, phone number, and contact person, was included in the bidding materials made available to each prospective bidder.

SEALED AND ELECTRONIC PROPOSALS will be received by the Capital Finance Director, acting on behalf of the State of Wisconsin Building Commission (Commission), at the Reception Area, Administration Building, 101 East Wilson Street – 10th Floor, Madison, Wisconsin, until 10:00 a.m. (CDT) on July 12, 2000, when they will be publicly opened and read, for the purchase of \$35,000,000 State of Wisconsin General Obligation Bonds of 2000, Series B (Taxable) (Bonds) on the terms and conditions stated below. Sealed proposals must be delivered to the Reception Area – 10th Floor, Administration Building, 101 East Wilson Street, Madison, Wisconsin. Electronic proposals must be submitted through Bloomberg Services, Dalcomp/Parity, or MuniAuction (Approved Providers). Sealed proposals will be opened, electronic proposals retrieved, and all proposals publicly announced in the Reception Area shortly after the deadline for proposals.

Terms of the Bonds. The Bonds will be dated July 1, 2000, and will be payable as to principal either through serial maturities or redemption from mandatory sinking fund payments (as specified by the successful bidder) on November 1 of each year, in the years and principal amounts as follows:

Each bid must specify whether the principal amount of the Bonds payable on a particular date will be a payment at maturity of a serial bond or a mandatory sinking fund payment of a term bond. The mandatory sinking fund payments of each term bond shall be on one or more consecutive annual payment dates immediately preceding the maturity date of such term bond. Term bonds may be created with a final maturity either before or after November 1, 2010; however, no term bonds designated to mature on and after November 1, 2011 may contain any sinking fund payments before November 1, 2010. The mandatory sinking fund payment (if any) so specified for any year must be equal to the full principal amount of Bonds listed in the table above as payable in that year. The same interest rate specified for the nominal maturity of a term bond must also be specified for all mandatory sinking fund payments of such term bond.

The Bonds will bear interest, payable on May 1, 2001 and semiannually thereafter on the first day of May and November, at such rate or rates per annum as designated by the successful bidder in its official bid. Interest on the Bonds will be computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months.

^{*} Preliminary; subject to change. The final principal amount for each maturity or mandatory sinking fund payment of the Bonds will be determined by the Capital Finance Director after verification of the bids. See "ADJUSTMENT OF PRINCIPAL AMOUNT AND PURCHASE PRICE" in this Official Notice of Sale.

Optional Redemption. The Bonds maturing in the years 2001 to 2010, inclusive, are not subject to optional redemption but are subject to special redemption as described later in this notice. The Bonds maturing on or after November 1, 2011 are subject to optional redemption at the option of the Commission on November 1, 2010 or any date thereafter, in whole or in part, in integral multiples of \$5,000. In the event of partial redemption, the Commission shall direct the maturity or maturities and the amount thereof so to be redeemed. Bonds redeemed prior to their stated dates of maturity shall be redeemable at 100% of principal amount plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. The Bonds of certain maturities will be subject to mandatory redemption prior to their respective stated maturity dates, in part, from mandatory sinking fund payments, to the extent the successful bidder specifies, in its bid, that the principal amount of the Bonds payable on certain dates shall constitute mandatory sinking fund payments of term bonds.

Special Redemption. All Bonds are subject to special redemption prior to maturity, at the option of the Commission, on November 1, 2001 and any date thereafter, in whole or in part, at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount to be redeemed, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption, from unexpended proceeds of the Bonds. In addition, all Bonds are subject to special redemption prior to maturity, at the option of the Commission, in whole or in part, on any date, at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount to be redeemed, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption, from prepayments of veterans primary mortgage home loans funded with proceeds of the Bonds, or from interest or income on investments in certain accounts attributed to the Bonds. In the event of partial redemption, the Commission shall direct the maturities of the Bonds to be redeemed. All special redemptions are intended to be pro rata on all applicable outstanding maturities, subject to rounding.

Book-Entry. The Bonds will be issued as fully registered bonds without coupons and, when issued, will be registered only in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York (DTC). DTC will act as securities depository of the Bonds. A single bond certificate for each separate maturity will be issued to DTC and immobilized in its custody. Individual purchases will be made in book-entry-only form pursuant to the rules and procedures established between DTC and its participants, in the principal amount of \$5,000 and integral multiples thereof. Individual purchasers will not receive certificates evidencing their ownership of the Bonds purchased. The bond certificates will be deposited with DTC as a condition of the closing. The State of Wisconsin (State) will make payments of principal and interest on the Bonds on the dates set forth above, to DTC or its nominee as registered owner of the Bonds in same-day funds. Transfer of said payments to participants of DTC will be the responsibility of DTC; transfer of said payments to beneficial owners by DTC participants will be the responsibility of such participants and other nominees of beneficial owners all as required by rules and procedures of DTC and the participants. No assurance can be given by the State that DTC, its participants, and other nominees of beneficial owners will make prompt transfer of said payments. The State assumes no liability for failures of DTC, its participants, or other nominees to promptly transfer said payments to beneficial owners of the Bonds.

Notice to Securities Depository. Notices, if any, given by the State to the securities depository are redistributed in the same manner as are payments. The State assumes no liability for the failure of the securities depository, its participants, or other nominees to promptly transfer said notices to the beneficial owners of the Bonds. The State is not responsible for supervising the activities or reviewing the records of the securities depository or its direct and indirect participants.

Successor to Securities Depository. In the event that the securities depository relationship with the securities depository is terminated and the Commission does not appoint a successor securities depository, the Commission will prepare, authenticate and deliver, at its expense, fully registered certificated bonds in the denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof in the aggregate principal amount of Bonds of the same maturities and interest rates then outstanding to the beneficial owners of the Bonds as identified to the Commission by the securities depository and its participants.

Purpose and Pledge. The Bonds will be issued, to make funds available for veterans primary mortgage home loans, pursuant to Chapters 18, 20, and 45 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and an authorizing resolution adopted by the Commission on June 28, 2000. The Bonds will be direct and general obligations of the State. The full faith, credit, and taxing power of the State will be irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and there will be irrevocably appropriated, as a first charge upon all revenues of the State, a sum sufficient for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds.

Minority Participation. It is the policy of the Commission to endeavor to ensure that firms that are certified by the State as being minority owned underwrite 6% of the Bonds. The Commission urges prospective bidders to obtain from the Commission a list of firms so certified and to include such firms in their bidding group. The Commission further encourages certified minority-owned firms to submit bids directly and to assemble bidding groups for the submission of bids. Minority-owned firms that are not yet certified by the State and wish to be, may contact the Wisconsin Department of Commerce, Bureau of Minority Business Development at 608,267,9550.

Offering of Securities. The State offers to sell these securities by competitive bid. In the jurisdictions of Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Nebraska, New York, North Dakota and Vermont, the State's offer is limited to the following: brokers, dealers, banks, savings institutions, trust companies, insurance companies, investment companies, pension or profit sharing trusts, and other financial institutions.

No Bond Insurance. The award of the Bonds will be made with the understanding that no bond insurance will be used in connection with the primary offering of the Bonds. The successful bidder shall certify to the Commission, prior to the delivery of the Bonds, that no bond insurance policy has been obtained by or on behalf of it or any other member of its underwriting group (whether or not a member of the bidding group) during the "primary offering" of the Bonds (as such term is defined in paragraph (f)(7) of Rule 15c2-12 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934). This requirement does not prohibit insuring the Bonds in secondary market transactions or with portfolio insurance.

Electronic Bidding. Bidders who intend to submit electronic proposals must submit a signed Agreement About Use of Electronic Bidding Service Provider to the Capital Finance Director prior to the bid opening. The Commission assumes no responsibility or liability for bids submitted through an Approved Provider. If any provisions in this Official Notice of Sale conflict with information provided by an Approved Provider, this Official Notice of Sale shall control. Official Bid Form and Award. Proposals must be made using the Official Bid Form, and all electronic proposals shall be deemed to incorporate the provisions of the Official Bid Form. The Bonds will be awarded at the lowest true interest cost rate to the State. The true interest cost rate for each bid will be determined on the basis of present value by doubling the semiannual interest rate, compounded semiannually, necessary to discount the debt service payments to July 1, 2000 and to the price bid. In the event two or more bids specify the same lowest true interest cost rate, then the award will be made to the bidder with the lowest true interest cost rate and the largest minority-owned firm participation, or if such bidders have an equal amount of minority-owned participation, then selection for award will be made among such bidders by the Capital Finance Director by lot.

Each bid shall indicate an interest rate for each maturity and a purchase price for the Bonds. Each interest rate bid must be a multiple of 0.05%. A bid must be for all of the Bonds and may be for any purchase price not less than 98% of the par amount of the Bonds (\$34,300,000.00) nor greater than 101% of the par amount of the Bonds (\$35,350,000.00). There shall be only one interest rate per maturity. Bonds maturing on or after November 1, 2011 may not have an initial offering price less than 98.5% of par. No later than one-half hour after verbal notification of being the apparent high bidder, the "when, as and if issued" offering prices of all the Bonds, which correspond to the purchase price and gross spread on the Official Bid Form, must be communicated to the Capital Finance Office. In the interest of price transparency in the market, the State encourages the successful bidder to promptly make public the initial offering prices for all the Bonds. The Capital Finance Director, acting on behalf of the Commission, may waive any informality or irregularity in any bid or condition of this Official Notice of Sale and reject any or all bids.

Adjustment of Principal Amount and Purchase Price. After selecting the winning bid, the Capital Finance Director will determine the final principal amount of each maturity or mandatory sinking fund payment (Final Maturity Amounts) for the Bonds. Each of the maturities or mandatory sinking fund payments listed in the table on page 1 may be decreased or increased by an amount not to exceed 15% of the maturity or mandatory sinking fund payment. The aggregate par amount of the Bonds shall not change. Such adjusted principal amounts for each maturity or mandatory sinking fund payment shall constitute the Final Maturity Amounts. The successful bidder may not withdraw its bid or change the interest rates bid or the initial reoffering prices as a result of any changes made to the bid amounts within these limits. The Final Maturity Amounts will be communicated to the successful bidder by 3:30 p.m. (CDT) on the day of the sale. The purchase price bid by the successful bidder will be adjusted. Any adjustment made in the purchase price will be made to maintain the gross spread calculated for the original bid, based upon the interest rates set forth in the Official Bid Form or electronic proposal and the assumed "when, as and if issued" offering prices of the Bonds.

Bid Deposit. A certified, official, or cashier's check must be provided, or a financial surety bond submitted, for each bid, payable to the order of the State of Wisconsin, in the amount of \$700,000.00. If a check is provided, it must accompany the bid. If a financial surety bond is submitted, it must be from an insurance company licensed to issue such a bond in the State of Wisconsin and acceptable to the Capital Finance Director, and such bond must be submitted to the Capital Finance Office prior to the opening of the bids. The financial surety bond must identify each bidder whose deposit is guaranteed by such bond. Each bidder submitting a financial surety bond should determine

for itself that the financial surety bond is submitted prior to the bidding deadline. If the bid is awarded to a bidder that has submitted a financial surety bond, the bidder is required to provide the good-faith deposit in immediately available funds not later than 1:30 p.m. (CDT) on July 13, 2000. A claim may be made under the financial surety bond in the event that the good-faith deposit is not timely. Bids shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope marked on the outside, in substance, *Bid for State of Wisconsin General Obligation Bonds of 2000, Series B (Taxable)*.

Good-Faith Deposit. The good-faith deposit of the successful bidder will be cashed. All checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately upon award of the Bonds. No interest will be allowed on the amount of the good-faith deposit. The proceeds of the good-faith deposit of the successful bidder will be applied to the purchase price of the Bonds, or in the event of the failure of the successful bidder to take up and pay for the Bonds in compliance with the terms of the bid, its good-faith deposit may, at the option of the Commission, be retained as liquidated damages or, at the further option of the Commission, be retained as partial payment of actual damages or as security for any other remedy available to the Commission. The amount of the good-faith deposit is to be returned to the successful bidder on the failure of the Commission to perform in accordance with the terms of this Official Notice of Sale and the bid. All bids shall remain firm for five hours after the time specified for the opening of bids and an award of the Bonds, or rejection of all bids, will be made by the Capital Finance Director within said period of time.

Closing and Delivery. The closing will be at a mutually agreeable location at or about 9:30 a.m. (EDT), on or about August 2, 2000. The Bonds will be delivered to DTC no later than the day prior to the closing. Payment for the Bonds must be made by wire in immediately available funds for credit at Firstar Bank, National Association at said date and time. Should delivery be delayed beyond 45 days from date of sale for any reason beyond the control of the State except failure of performance by the successful bidder, the State may cancel the award or the successful bidder may demand return of its good-faith deposit and thereafter its interest in and liability for the Bonds will cease.

Bond Opinion. The legality of the Bonds will be approved by Foley & Lardner, bond counsel, whose unqualified approving opinion will be furnished to the successful bidder without cost upon the delivery of the Bonds. There will also be furnished upon the delivery of the Bonds the usual closing papers, including a certificate stating that there is no litigation pending or threatened affecting the validity of or security for the Bonds and a certificate to the effect that the Official Statement prepared in connection with the sale of the Bonds, as of the date of the Official Statement and as of the date of delivery of the Bonds, does not contain any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state any material fact necessary to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading.

Taxable Bonds. Under existing law interest on the Bonds is included in the gross income for federal income tax purposes.

Continuing Disclosure. In order to assist bidders in complying with Section (b)(5) of Rule 15c2-12 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the State has executed a Master Agreement on Continuing Disclosure and a Supplemental Agreement specifically for the Bonds (Continuing Disclosure Documents). The Continuing Disclosure Documents will be included in the transcript of proceedings.

CUSIP Numbers. CUSIP identification numbers will be specified on the Bonds, but such numbers shall not constitute a part of the contract evidenced by the Bonds and any error or omission with respect thereto shall not constitute cause for refusal by the purchaser to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the terms of the purchaser's bid.

Bidding Documents. The Preliminary Official Statement is available electronically at the world wide web address shown below. This report is required by subsection (7) of 18.16 of the Wisconsin Statutes and specifies the reason for not complying with subsections (2) to (5) of the same section for a specific issue of debt.

On June 28, 2000, the Building Commission authorized the sale of \$87,715,000 State of Wisconsin General Obligation Bonds of 2000, Series C (the "Bonds"). Pursuant to this authorization, on July 19, 2000, the Capital Finance Director conducted a public sale for and awarded the Bonds. This was a public sale conducted pursuant to Subchapter I of Chapter 18. The attached Official Notice of Sale, dated July 12, 2000, set the terms and conditions of the sale and was available to all potential bidders. The State received seven bids for the Bonds.

The award was based on the lowest true interest cost rate to the State. The successful underwriters were a syndicate managed by US Bancorp Piper Jaffray. A list of the syndicate members is attached. There are no firms in the syndicate that are certified by the Department of Commerce as minority owned.

Underwriting participation by minority owned firms is encouraged. There is a section "Minority Participation" in the Official Notice of Sale and the attached list of the certified minority owned firms, which includes address, phone number, and contact person, was included in the bidding materials made available to each prospective bidder.

Sealed proposals must be delivered to the Reception Area. Electronic proposals must be submitted through Bloomberg Services, Dalcomp/Parity, or MuniAuction (Approved Providers). Sealed proposals will be opened, electronic proposals retrieved, and all proposals publicly announced in the Reception Area shortly after the deadline for proposals.

Terms of Bonds. The Bonds will be dated July 15, 2000, and will be payable as to principal either through serial maturities or redemption from mandatory sinking fund payments (as specified by the successful bidder) on May 1 of each year, in the years and principal amounts as follows:

Each bid must specify whether the principal amount of the Bonds payable on a particular date will be a payment at maturity of a serial bond or a mandatory sinking fund payment of a term bond. The mandatory sinking fund payments of each term bond shall be on one or more consecutive annual payment dates immediately preceding the maturity date of such term bond. The mandatory sinking fund payment (if any) so specified for any year must be equal to the full principal amount of Bonds listed in the table above as payable in that year. The same interest rate specified for the nominal maturity of a term bond must also be specified for all mandatory sinking fund payments of such term bond.

Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. Book-Entry. Transfer of payments to participants of DTC will be the responsibility of DTC; transfer of payments to beneficial owners by DTC participants will be the responsibility of the participants and other nominees of beneficial owners, all as required by rules and procedures of DTC and the participants. No assurance can be given by the State that DTC, its participants, and other nominees of beneficial owners will make prompt transfer of the payments. The State assumes no liability for failures of DTC, its participants, or other nominees to promptly transfer payments to beneficial owners of the Bonds.

Notice to Securities Depository. Notices, if any, given by the State to the securities depository are redistributed in the same manner as are payments. The State assumes no liability for the failure of the securities depository, its participants, or other nominees of beneficial owners to promptly transfer said notices to the beneficial owners of the Bonds. The State is not responsible for supervising the activities or reviewing the records of the securities depository or its direct and indirect participants.

Successor to Securities Depository. In the event that the relationship with the current securities depository is terminated and the Commission does not appoint a successor securities depository, the Commission will prepare, authenticate, and deliver, at its expense, fully registered certificated Bonds in the denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof, in the aggregate principal amount of Bonds of the same maturities and interest rates then outstanding, to the beneficial owners of the Bonds as identified to the Commission by the securities depository and its participants.

Purpose and Pledge. The Bonds will be issued to finance the cost of various public improvements and grants to local units of government, pursuant to Chapter 18 of the Wisconsin Statutes and a resolution adopted by the Commission on June 28, 2000. The Bonds will be direct and general obligations of the State. Official Bid Form and Award. Sealed proposals must be made using the Official Bid Form, and all electronic proposals shall be deemed to incorporate the provisions of the Official Bid Form. The Bonds will be awarded at the lowest true interest cost rate to the State. The true interest cost rate for each bid will be determined on the basis of present value by doubling the semiannual interest rate, compounded semiannually, necessary to discount the debt service payments to July 15, 2000 and to the price bid. Stats.), and confirms that the Department of Administration has found it necessary to exercise the "temporary reallocation of balances" authority provided by this section in order to meet payment responsibilities and cover resulting negative balances during the month of June 2000.

On June 1, 2000 the <u>Wisconsin Health Education Loan Repayment Fund</u> balance was -\$8 thousand. This shortfall increased to -\$10 thousand on June 13, 2000, to -\$11 thousand on June 27, 2000, and continued until July 25, 2000 when the balance reached \$9 thousand. This shortfall was due to the timing of revenues.

On June 1, 2000 the <u>Wisconsin Lottery Fund</u> balance was -\$7.71 million. This shortfall decreased to -\$3.82 million on June 8, 2000, to -\$1.98 million on June 15, 2000, and continued until June 16, 2000 when the balance reached \$1.36 million. This shortfall was due to a timing difference between the distribution of property tax credits and the receipt of Lottery revenues.

On June 1, 2000 the **University Trust – Income Fund** balance was -\$183 thousand. This shortfall increased to -\$204 thousand on June 5, 2000, to -\$359 thousand on June 7, 2000, and continued until June 8, 2000 when the balance reached \$581 thousand. This shortfall was due to the timing of revenues.

The Wisconsin Health Education Loan Repayment Fund, Wisconsin Lottery Fund, and University Trust – Income Fund shortfalls were not in excess of the statutory interfund borrowing limitation and did not exceed the balances of the Funds available for interfund borrowing.

The distribution of interest earnings to investment pool participants is based on the

The cash position of the General Fund at June 30 was \$671.6 million, which is lower than the \$742.9 million projected in our report to you on June 15, 2000. This difference is due to higher than expected General Fund disbursements. The cash activity for the quarter was as follows:

REPORT ON PETROLEUM STORAGE REMEDIAL ACTION; FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND PETROLEUM STORAGE TANK DISCHARGES (JANUARY 1, 2000 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2000)

This report fulfills the requirement that the Departments of Commerce and Natural Resources semi-annually submit a report on the status of activities related to petroleum storage remedial action; financial assistance and petroleum storage tank discharges (hereinafter referred to as the Program). As directed in section 101.143(11), Stats., the report summarizes activities completed within the Program during the period of January 1, 2000 through June 30, 2000. Both agencies respectfully submit this report to the Governor, the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, and the Joint Committee on Finance, and to other appropriate standing committees of the legislature as directed by the statute.

SUMMARY OF RECENT ACTIVITY

Significant changes within the program during the first six months of CY2000 include: the promulgation of the most recent version of emergency rule COMM 46 and NR 746 which incorporates additional risk-based criteria for closure of petroleum cleanup sites, and the continued implementation of the shift of approximately 1,800 additional petroleum sites to the Department of Commerce based on statutory changes contained in the provisions of the 1999-2001 biennial budget bill.

◆ Emergency Rule COMM46 / NR746 [promulgated May 17, 2000]

The agencies were directed by the Joint Committee on Review of Administrative Rules to incorporate additional risk-based decision making into the remediation process for petroleum contaminated sites, and were directed to implement an emergency rule in January 1999. The purpose of the rule was to codify the memorandum of understanding between the departments, as well as allow for closure criteria for clay sites based on risk factors. The most recent version of the emergency rule COMM46 and NR746 was promulgated on May 17, 2000. Public hearings were held on June 15, July 10, and July 12 in Madison, Milwaukee and Wausau, respectively. The final rule is expected to be finalized this Fall.

Key factors of the current emergency rule include: definition of high, medium and low risk sites; a description of risk assessment criteria; the determination of when sites are allowed to close directly after completion of the site investigation in addition to after remediation; determination of when remediation by natural attenuation may be approved as the final remedial strategy for a contamination site; qualitative table values for concentrations of contaminants in soil indicating free product; qualitative groundwater values; provisions for remediation decision-making between the departments; closure processes, and; the administrative relationship between the two agencies.

Issues that are the focus of current discussions between the agencies include: tracking the achievement of remediation progress and success, and joint agency reporting of program activities.

Remedial Bid Process

Competitive bidding of remediation programs has resulted in substantial cost savings to the program, with the projected costs to closure over 75% less than the initial proposed remedial plans.

There were 65 sites included in the first six bid rounds. The initial remedial action plans proposed for the sites totaled \$12,896,598. After competitive bidding, the winning bids totaled \$3,914,800 for completion of the remedial programs. This demonstrates savings of over \$8,981,798.

As part of the public bidding, the agencies have agreed upon a joint decision-making process for the selection of remedial bids and the setting of remediation targets.

Revenue Bonding

The biennial budget bill resulted in several significant process changes within PECFA, including the authorization of \$270 million in revenue bonding to reduce the backlog. Two stages of bonding occurred in March and April 2000. A total of \$221,319,548 in bonding was paid out to over 3770 claims. The claim review backlog is currently less than 3 months.

Tranfer of Files from Department of Natural Resources to Department of Commerce

The revised statutes defined the high-risk sites as well as the assignment of work responsibilities between the DNR and Commerce. The statutes provide that sites defined as high risk will remain under the jurisdiction of the Department of Natural Resources. The medium and low risk sites will remain under the jurisdiction of the Department of Commerce, except those that are also contaminated with a hazardous substance other than a petroleum product or additive. The statutes also limited high risk classification to no more than 35% of the petroleum sites (excluding co-contamination sites) as of December 1, 1999. Jurisdiction of the sites was determined by December 1, 1999, and files have been transferred to Commerce as closure requests were submitted. The complete transfer of all medium and low-risk sites was initiated on June 1, 2000, and completed by July 31, 2000. Over 1800 files were transferred to Commerce during this period.

Cost Controls

The Department of Commerce is in the process of developing rules for site priority categorization, deductibles, the bidding process, cost caps, service fees, and performance and cost reporting. The department is directed to:

- Affirm that reimbursement for sites was limited to the least costly method of completing the remedial action activities while complying with the groundwater enforcement standards.
- Require increased use of the competitive bidding process to assist in determining the least costly method of remedial action.
- Increase the deductibles for many site owners.
- Reduce the reimbursement for interest costs as applicants' gross revenues increase, and:
- Establish a role for a schedule of usual and customary costs.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES RELATED TO PETROLEUM STORAGE REMEDIAL ACTION; FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND PETROLEUM STORAGE TANK DISCHARGES January 1 through June 30, 2000

The following information summarizes the activities conducted within the Program during the first six months of CY2000 (January 1 through June 30, 2000) as directed in 101.143 (11).

1. STATUS OF REMEDIATION OF PETROLEUM SITES

The following is provided for each petroleum product storage tank system and home oil tank system from which a discharge has occurred and for which remedial activities began during the period from 1/1/00 through 6/30/00:

- (a) the date of receipt of the SIR
- (b) a list of the environmental risk factors identified at the site
- (c) the year in which the closure approval is expected to be issued

A list of sites by the date of receipt of the site investigation report (SIR) is prepared and provided as Attachment A. The list of environmental risk factors is provided by the Department of Natural Resources, and is also provided in Attachment A.

For the third requirement under this section, the departments are not able to provide the year in which closure approval is expected at this time. This information will be submitted in the annual reporting required from the consultants (on behalf of the responsible parties) as directed under 101.143(2)(I)2, Stats. The joint rules specifying the content and timing of these reports were promulgated in emergency rule COMM47/NR746 on May 17, 2000. These rules specify that the first report must be submitted no later than January 1, 2001, and subsequent reports must be submitted annually thereafter. This information will be available for reporting in the January 2001 semiannual report.

3. HIGH RISK SITES

"High-risk site" is defined in the statute to mean the site of a discharge of a petroleum product from a petroleum product storage tank if at least one of the following applies:

- (a) Repeated tests show that the discharge has resulted in a concentration of contaminants in a well used to provide water for human consumption that exceeds a preventative action limit, as defined in s. 160.01 (6).
- (b) Petroleum product that is not in a dissolved phase is present with a thickness of 0.01 feet or more, as shown by repeated measurements.
- (c) An enforcement standard is exceeded in groundwater within 1000 feet of a well operated by a public utility, as defined in s. 196.01 (5), or within 100 feet of any other well used to provide water for human consumption.
- (d) An enforcement standard is exceeded in bedrock.

As of August 1, 2000, 33% of the sites classified under the new definition, excluding those that are also contaminated with a hazardous substance other than a petroleum product or additive, were classified as "high risk" under the new definition. This is consistent with the statutory requirement that no more that 35% of the sites classified, excluding those with co-contamination, be classified as high risk. Considering all sites, including those with co-contamination, and those with unknown classification, DNR has jurisdiction for 60% of the sites and Commerce jurisdiction for 40% of the sites. There were 2,561 unclassified sites as of December 31,1999; this number has dropped to 2,212 as of July 31, 2000. The remaining unclassified sites will be classified when sufficient information to make a decision is submitted to either of the agencies.

4. ENGINEERING CONSULTING FIRMS PROVIDING SERVICES TO CLAIMANTS

The name of each firm providing engineering consulting services under the Program is included in the list of PECFA-eligible consultants, which is provided as Attachment B. In several cases where the consulting firm has offices that are independently registered, the firm name will be listed more than once to account for all the registered locations. This list currently includes 254 engineering consulting firms.

A list of the number of claimants to whom the engineering firms are providing services is provided in Attachment C. Similar to the list of PECFA-eligible consultants, there are several firms that are listed more than once. The list of companies currently providing services to claimants within the Program includes 179 firms.

5. CHARGES FOR ENGINEERING CONSULTING SERVICES

The charges for engineering consulting services for site activities within the Program (including closure requests as well as sites in status other than closure) were \$27,181,942. It is important to note that these were not costs paid out during the first six months of CY2000, but rather, are a total of the engineering consulting costs included in claims which were submitted and reviewed during calendar year 1999. A breakdown of the current charges to the program for the reporting period is included in Attachment D.

The total charges for engineering consulting services for petroleum sites claimed for the tenyear period from January 1989 through June 30, 2000 were **\$319,116,402**. A breakdown of the total charges for Program costs (claimed to date) is included in Attachment D.

6. CHARGES BY PROVIDERS OTHER THAN ENGINEERING CONSULTING FIRMS

The charges by service providers other than engineering consultants for services for which reimbursement is provided under the Program (including excavating, hauling, laboratory testing, and landfill disposal) are provided below, and a breakdown of the total charges for program claims is provided in Attachment D.

The chart summarizes the costs that were submitted to the Department during the first six months of CY2000 (not those costs paid out), as well as the total costs submitted to date. These costs are further explained below:

7. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

There were no dispute resolution issues between the departments during this reporting period related to the annual review reporting, as the annual review information has not yet been provided. These annual reviews will begin after the initial annual reports are submitted by the consultants (January 1, 2001).

8. MONITORING OF QUESTIONABLE CLAIMS & COMPLAINTS, INCLUDING FRAUD

The PECFA Bureau continues with the following on-going strategies for identifying possible fraud in the program:

During claim review, staff actively watch for evidence of fraud within the program, including compliance with bid procedures as well as appropriateness of information provided in documents submitted. A follow-up audit is conducted if there is enough information available to pursue an investigation.

The Department of Commerce has finalized a contract with the Department of Justice to fund two additional staff within the Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation to provide assistance in the identification and evaluation of potential fraud cases, compilation of proof to enable prosecutors to take appropriate legal action, documentation of fraud investigations, and testimony in court.

When complaints are received from claimants regarding engineering consulting firms (non-fraud issues), the complaints are entered and tracked in "consultant complaint folders". These complaint folders are maintained on a consulting-firm basis. In addition, the Department of Commerce regularly refers claimant to the Department of Regulation and Licensing, where the complainant has additional recourse.
