5. Clarity, Grammar, Punctuation and Use of Plain Language

- a. In s. Trans 252.05 (1), "or" following "gross vehicle weight" could be replaced by an underscored comma. Also, the underscored comma on the last line should follow "and".
- b. Section Trans 252.05 (3) (c) should be created in a separate Section of the rule and should not be underscored.
- c. In s. Trans 252.05 (3) (c) 1., will it be clear to readers what is meant by "solid state construction"?

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: s. 348.25(3), Stats. STATUTES INTERPRETED: s. 348.25(3), Stats.

General Summary of Proposed Rule. This proposed rule will amend ch. Trans 252, relating to Escort Vehicles, to update some requirements reflecting changes in vehicle manufacturing and industry practices. The rule is amended to expand vehicles which may be used as escort vehicles to include single-unit trucks up to 32,000 pounds actual gross vehicle weight, gross vehicle weight rating, or registered weight. The proposed amendment clarifies the reference to a Type 1 automobile as defined in state law, and clarifies that any escort vehicle must meet the "overhang" requirements of s. 348.09, Stats., when carrying the required sign. The rule allows either the current sign or a smaller (5' long) sign. Finally, the proposed rule amendment eliminates the requirement that escort vehicles display flags on the bumpers but, instead, requires flashing lights or strobe lights that are visible all around (360 degrees).

<u>Fiscal Effect</u>. The proposed rule will have no fiscal impact on the State or local units of government.

<u>Initial Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. The proposed rule amendment will benefit small businesses involved in oversize/overweight load transport. The amendment reflects changes in vehicle manufacturing and industry practices, and thus should reduce business costs in complying with escort vehicle requirements. Escort vehicle requirements are necessary to adequately protect safety of the traveling public which may encounter an oversize/overweight load in transit.

TEXT OF PROPOSED RULE

Under the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, department of transportation, by s. 348.25(3), Stats., the department of transportation hereby proposes to amend a rule interpreting s. 348.25(3), Stats., relating to escort vehicles.

SECTION 1. Trans 252.02 is repealed and recreated to read:

TRANS 252.02 Definitions. Unless otherwise stated, the definitions of words and phrases in ss. 340.01 and 348.01(2), Stats., and s. Trans 250.02 apply to this chapter.

SECTION 2 Trans 252.05(1) is amended to read:

Trans 252.05(1) VEHICLE. An escort vehicle shall be a passenger Type 1 automobile or a light single-unit motor truck of not more than 32,000 pounds actual gross vehicle weight or gross vehicle weight rating or registered weight. The escort vehicle shall be so designed as to afford its driver a clear and unobstructed view to both front, and rear, right and left.

NOTE: The escort vehicle sign may not exceed "overhang" limitations specified in s. 348.09, Stats., which states:

348.09 Projecting loads on side of vehicles. (1) No person, without a permit therefor, shall operate on a highway any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer carrying any load extending beyond the fender line on the left side or extending more than 6 inches beyond the fender line on the right side of the vehicle. In the case of motor trucks, "fender line" means the outermost limits of the rear fenders, flare boards or floor of the body, whichever projects outward the farthest.

(2) This section applies even though the total width of the vehicle and load

does not exceed the maximum permitted under s. 348.05.

SECTION 3. Trans 252.05(2) is repealed.

SECTION 4. Trans 252.05(3) and (4) are renumbered Trans 252.05(2) and (3) and amended to read:

Trans 252.05(2) OVERSIZE LOAD SIGN. An escort A vehicle escorting an oversize vehicle shall have an "OVERSIZE LOAD" sign mounted above the roof of the escort vehicle and above any equipment mounted on the vehicle which would obscure an approaching driver's clear view of the sign. The lettering on the sign shall be 10 inches high in black on an a solid yellow or amber background and may not have a stroke width of less than one and five-eighths one-half inches. The sign may not be less than 6 5 feet wide or 18 14 inches high. The sign shall be visible to traffic approaching

from the front of an escort vehicle preceding a load. In the case of an escort vehicle operating to the rear of the load being transported, the sign shall be visible to traffic approaching from the rear. No sign message may be displayed to traffic when the escort vehicle is not escorting an oversize load.

- (3) WARNING LAMPS. (a) An escort vehicle shall be equipped with at least 2 amber warning lamps mounted on or above the vehicle roof. Each such warning lamp shall be equipped with a reflector at least 7 inches in diameter and shall flash, oscillate or rotate between 30 and 90 times per minute. Each such warning lamp shall have sufficient intensity to be clearly visible and attention-attracting at a distance of 500 feet, under all conditions when the oversize or overweight vehicle or load is on the highway, except when visibility of the lamp is temporarily obstructed by a hill crest, a curve or an object such as another vehicle.
- (b) The 2 amber warning lamps shall be mounted at the same level, shall be separated laterally as much as possible, shall be visible all around, or 360 degrees, and shall flash, oscillate or rotate simultaneously.
- (c) In lieu of amber warning lamps, an escort vehicle may be equipped with at least 2 amber strobe lights mounted on or above the vehicle roof at the same level, and spaced laterally as much as possible. These strobe lights shall comply with the following requirements:
- 1. The strobe light shall be of solid state construction. It shall emit an amber light by flashing 360 degrees around the vertical axis.
- 2. The strobe light shall be capable of operating continuously without any significant change in the flash rate under all operating conditions or weather extremes

experienced in this state. The flash rate shall be no less than 30 nor more than 120 per minute. The double flash effect shall be counted as a single flash.

3. The electronic power supply circuit shall provide sufficient light intensity to be clearly visible and attention-attracting at a distance of 500 feet, under all conditions when the oversize or overweight vehicle or load is on the highway, except when visibility of the lamp is temporarily obstructed by a hill crest, a curve, or an object such as another vehicle. The flash shall be so designed that there is a single or double flash or pulsing of the flash tube. A double flash unit may have different intensities with the first flash having the highest intensity.

SECTION 5. Trans 252.05(5) is renumbered Trans 252.05(4).

ANALYSIS OF FINAL DRAFT OF TRANS 252

- (a) Need for Amended Rule. This proposed rule will update some requirements reflecting changes in vehicle manufacturing and industry practices. The rule is amended to expand vehicles which may be used as escort vehicles to include single-unit trucks up to 16,000 pounds actual gross vehicle weight, gross vehicle weight rating, or registered weight. The proposed amendment clarifies the reference to a Type 1 automobile as defined in state law, and clarifies that any escort vehicle must meet the "overhang" requirements of s. 348.09, Stats., when carrying the required sign. The rule allows either the current sign or a smaller (5' x 12') sign. Finally, the proposed rule amendment eliminates the requirement that escort vehicles display flags on the bumpers but, instead, requires flashing lights or strobe lights that are visible all around (360 degrees).
- (b) Modifications as a Result of Testimony at Public Hearing. Section Trans 252.05(1) was modified by adding a sentence explaining that unobstructed view to the rear may be provided by outside mirrors on both sides of the escort vehicle, and by reducing the size of a motor truck used as an escort vehicle from 32,000 pounds to 16,000 pounds.

Section Trans 252.05(2) was modified by reducing the size of the "OVERSIZE LOAD" sign to 5 feet wide and 12 inches high, and by adding language clarifying that these dimensions refer to the visible surface of the sign.

Section Trans 252.05(3)(a) was modified by including a sentence explaining that warning lamps include strobe lights; by deleting the requirement that reflectors be at least 7 inches in diameter; by changing the flash, pulse, or rotation frequency to a range of from 30 to 120 per minute; and by explaining that multiple flash effect will be counted as a single flash.

Section Trans 252.05(3)(b) of the hearing draft was deleted.

The Legislative Council's question about the meaning of "solid state construction" was addressed by deleting this phrase, along with the remainder of s. Trans 252.05(3)(b).
- (e) <u>Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. The proposed rule amendment will benefit small businesses involved in oversize/overweight load transport. The amendment reflects changes in vehicle manufacturing and industry practices, and thus should reduce business costs in complying with escort vehicle requirements. Escort vehicle requirements are necessary to adequately protect safety of the traveling public which may encounter an oversize/overweight load in transit.

STATEMENT OF SCOPE

DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECTIVE OF THE RULE:

This rule making will amend ch. Trans 252, relating to Escort Vehicles, to update some requirements reflecting changes in vehicle manufacturing and industry practices.

DESCRIPTION OF EXISTING POLICIES RELEVANT TO THE RULE AND OF NEW POLICIES PROPOSED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RULE AND AN ANALYSIS OF POLICY ALTERNATIVES:

Currently, the rule requires escort vehicles to be either "passenger vehicle or light truck." We propose to expand allowable vehicles to include single-unit motor trucks up to 32,000 pounds, measured as the highest of actual gross weight, gross vehicle weight rating, or registered weight. This will allow transporters to use as escort vehicles larger trucks which would already be accompanying the oversize load. We propose the following:

- To clarify that "passenger automobile" in state law is defined as "Type 1 automobile," and to clarify that any escort vehicle must meet the "overhang" requirements of s. 348.09, Stats., when carrying the required sign. This will reduce confusion as to exactly what size and type of vehicle may be used as an escort vehicle.
- To allow either the currently required sign which is 6 feet long and says "oversize load" or a 5 foot long sign which says "oversize." Allowing a smaller sign will enable transporters more flexibility in the type and size of vehicle they may use as an escort vehicle.
- To eliminate the requirement that escort vehicles display flags on the vehicle bumpers but, instead, require flashing lights which are visible all around (360 degrees) and have a minimum required visibility. This change accommodates changes in the way vehicles are manufactured often a bumper is molded, rounded, and unable to securely hold a flag.
