Comments

[NOTE: All citations to "Manual" in the comments below are to the Administrative Rules Procedures Manual, prepared by the Revisor of Statutes Bureau and the Legislative Council Staff, dated September 1998.]

5. Clarity, Grammar, Punctuation and Use of Plain Language

- a. Section Trans. 316.01 (intro.) states that one of the purposes of ch. Trans 316 is to permit wood harvesting slashers to engage in limited operation on Wisconsin roads. However, ch. Trans 316 does not in any way address the manner in which wood harvesting slashers may be operated on Wisconsin highways or how this operation is limited. In addition, the purpose of s. 341.05 (25), Stats., which is the statutory authority for ch. Trans 316, is to exempt wood harvesting slashers from motor vehicle registration. However, ch. Trans 316 does not provide such an exemption. It is suggested that the rule address these questions.
- b. In s. Trans 316.01 (intro.) it appears that the word "limited" should replace the word "limit." In addition, in this section, the word "roads" should be replaced with the word "highways" because highways is the term used in s. 341.05 (25), Stats.
- c. Section Trans 316.02 (1) should be redrafted as a definition of "self-propelled slasher" because the term is defined as a certain type of slasher. This comment also applies to s. Trans 316.02 (3).
- d. Section Trans 316.02 (1) would be more clear if the term "independently powered" were replaced by the term "self-propelled when used" to make it clear that the defined term refers to a wood harvesting slasher that moves under its own power when used for cutting purposes.

- (3) "Truck-mounted" means a slasher that is permanently secured to a truck for use during cutting functions and for transport purposes.
- (4) "Wood harvesting slasher" means a unit with a mounted tree loader constructed specifically to cut trees to specific lengths and principally used off the highway. These units include either of the following:

- (a) A self-propelled unit mounted on or towed by an articulated semi-trailer or trailer that shall be considered as a single unit.
 - (b) A truck-mounted motorized unit that shall be considered as a single unit.



STATEMENT OF SCOPE

DESCRIPTION OF THE OBJECTIVE OF THE RULE:

1997 Wis. Act 269 created s. 341.05(25), Stats., which mandates the Department to define "wood harvesting slasher" by administrative rule. This rule making will create ch. Trans 316 to permit wood harvesting slashers to be included in the list of vehicles exempt from registration, and permit uniform enforcement of its exemption from vehicle registration requirements by both law enforcement and operators.

DESCRIPTION OF EXISTING POLICIES RELEVANT TO THE RULE AND OF NEW POLICIES PROPOSED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RULE AND AN ANALYSIS OF POLICY ALTERNATIVES:

Existing vehicle registration exemptions would be amended to include wood harvesting slashers, but would not include the units as "implements of husbandry." Law enforcement would be able to easily identify the units from the administrative rule definition and uniformly enforce law relating to the units' limited operation on Wisconsin roads.
