

Assembly Bill 24

Dear Senator Breske and Committee Members:

I appear before you today in support of Assembly Bill 24, proposed legislation requiring an inmate conducting telephone solicitation to identify himself or herself as a prisoner as well as the location of his or her correctional facility. When this bill was deliberated in the Assembly, I was unable to testify because I was residing in Europe. Thus your Committee hearing provides me with an opportunity to offer my support.

As Wisconsin's first, and only, State Privacy Advocate and now as Director of the Wisconsin Data Privacy Project, I have received numerous expressions of public concern over the use of inmates for telemarketing and personal data entry. Having inmates process aggregate (non-identifiable) information is quite appropriate; however, giving prisoners access to home telephone numbers raises legitimate concerns about the possibility of using that information for subsequent criminal activity or harassment. If prisoners are to be permitted to make telephone solicitations, they should - at a minimum - identify themselves and the facility in which they are incarcerated.

Citizen concerns do not arise out of a vacuum. A few years ago the New York Times reported how a convicted pedophile in a Minnesota state prison stored names of over 900 individuals, many of them children, on his computer. A similar situation occurred about the same time in Huntsville, Texas where a prisoner working for Metromail, one of the nation's largest commercial mailers, sent threatening letters to an Ohio grandmother who had completed a Metromail survey. Given the dramatic rise of identity theft, the public is justifiably skittish about unknown third parties having access to personal information that could in some way be linked and used to create a false identity. A person's telephone number is one such linker.

This bill is not unreasonable, and it should not hamper job training programs in prisons. Full notice to consumers regarding who's behind any telephone solicitation is the first step toward leveling the playing field between the information provider (in this case the person being interrupted by a phone solicitation) and the information processor (in this case a prisoner). The time has come for recipients of telemarketers' calls to reclaim a basic *right to know* who's calling, so they can exercise their *right to choose* whether or not to hang up.

For these reasons I urge your support of Assembly Bill 24.
