

SENATE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE APRIL 14, 1999 Testimony, Carson P. Frazier

AB 59: eliminate statutorily specified expiration dates:

- This bill eliminates three remaining actual *dates* listed in the statutes, for registration expiration:
 - ***Farm trucks*** which currently expire on the last day of February of even numbered years
 - ***Motorcycles/mopeds*** which currently expire on April 30 of even-numbered years
 - ***\$5/5 year registrations*** which currently expire on December 31 of 1993 and every 5 years after that.
- These are the last remaining expiration dates actually specified in statute.
- Over the last few years, we have requested and the legislature has eliminated several other dates that were actually listed in statute.
- We do not intend to change expiration periods in the foreseeable future.
- However, we would like to eliminate the statutory limitation on the actual date, because if we ever need to change registration periods, to balance our workload for example, we could not do under current law.

Dear Senator Breske: *Roger*

I would like to bring your attention to five bills, Assembly Bills 54, 55, 56, 58 and 59, which have been referred to the Senate Insurance, Tourism, Transportation and Corrections Committee.

As you know, all five of these bills were introduced at the request of the Department of Transportation. Assembly Bill 54 makes the purchase of dealer plates by motor vehicle salvage pools optional. Assembly Bill 55 eliminates the mandatory revocation of a dealer license for misuse of dealer plates. Assembly Bill 56 equalizes the penalties for noncompliance with the Single State Insurance Registration System. Assembly Bill 58 eliminates the word "retail" in statutory references relating to motor vehicle auction dealer penalties and Assembly Bill 59 eliminates the three remaining statutory specified vehicle registration expiration dates.

During the public hearings on these bills, no one testified or registered in opposition. All of them were unanimously approved by the Assembly Transportation Committee and passed the Assembly on voice votes. Thus, I am respectfully requesting that Assembly Bills 54, 55, 56, 58 and 59 be scheduled for consideration by your committee. If you have questions regarding any of these bills, please let me know.
