Pursuant to our discussion last week, the enclosed amendment modifies the provisions of Senate Bill 8 so that a wholesaler operating in Milwaukee (i.e. Wisconsin's only first class city) may operate until 9:00 p.m. daily. The purpose of this amendment is to allow Senator George to address the concern of his constituent operating in Milwaukee where local economics dictate the necessity for longer hours of operation without affecting the hours of operation throughout the state.

Assuming that upon your review of this amendment it meets with your approval, it would be my hope that we can include this amendment to Senate Bill 8 while it is being considered by Senator Breske's committee.

AMENDMENT 1 TO SENATE BILL 8

1 Amendment 1 to SB8 deletes lines 4-7 of SB8 and substitutes the following language
2 amending section 125.68(4)(a):

3 125.68 (4)(a) *Wholesalers.* 1. Except within a 1st class city, nNo premises for which
4 a wholesale intoxicating liquor permit has been issued may remain open for the sale of
5 intoxicating liquor between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m., except on Saturday the premises
6 may remain open until 9 p.m.

7 2. Within a 1st class city, no premises for which a wholesale intoxicating liquor
8 permit has been issued may remain open for the sale of intoxicating liquor between the hours
9 of 9 p.m. and 8 a.m.

[The purpose of Amendment 1 is to limit the expanded hours to those premises located in a city of the first class.]
