If one move like this is put down once  
 a month, then that's \$240,000 a year.

## 4. EXTORTION

FBI clothes are purchased through the appropriate catalog hats, jackets, etc. Fake FBI badges are manufactured. 13 or 14 stores around the city experience chaos. Broken windows, arson, vandalism. All that stuff that police laugh at, but causes great dismay to the fancy restaurant owners, or liquor store salesmen. This happens every day for ~~week~~ a week, to that many stores.

Soon, the FBI is impersonated, and visits the owner's of each store or restaurant. "FBI... I have gotten reports your business has been vandalized and abused. Well, that is organized crime. What can we do? Nothing. It is flawless in its conception. I suspect someone will be coming to you requesting \$500 to stop. Well, this is wrong. It must be stopped. I know this man, he isn't legal, but he is good. If you want, I can arrange it with him that he sees to it this is stopped. But, he will request a small weekly price, but I promise it will only be a fraction of what they would ask. He is really the only solution I can provide. I wish I could do more, but I am impaired. I have rules I have to follow, and those rules what those criminals are working beyond. I

will send him to you though."

Then, a man goes to see them. "YEA. I CAN GIVE A GUARANTEE THAT IT WILL STOP. IF IT DOESN'T STOP, YOU DON'T PAY. \$150 A WEEK."

NOW, THAT IS VERY PITY FOR BUSINESS, AND TO REPLACE A BIG WINDOW COSTS MORE THAN THAT. WHO WOULDN'T AGREE? NOW, YOU HAVE 13 OR 14, MAYBE UP TO 20 BUSINESSES PAYING YOU IN THIS MANNER. THATS \$1,960 A WEEK FOR 13 BUSINESS, \$3,000 A WEEK FOR 20 BUSINESSES. AND THAT IS FOR SAY, 2 MONTHS OF WORK. NOW, YOU CAN SIT ON YOUR ASS AND DO NOTHING, AND STILL MAKE MONEY EVERY WEEK.

SAY THIS GOES ON FOR 12 MONTHS, THESE PAYMENTS. THATS AN ESTIMATED \$96,000 A YEAR IF 20 BUSINESS ARE WORKED, THATS \$144,000 DOLLARS A YEAR.

## 5. Robberies

82% of Robberies goes unsolved. By Robberies, I mean street muggings and 7-11 stick ups.

Post 3 men throughout the city, dressed in all BLACK from head to toe. PLACE them around ATM machine's at night, say 8:pm. PLACE them by checks cashed places too. We'll use, for ease of calculation purposes, one of the 3 men as an example.

You're average ATM customer withdraws \$200. But can be forced to withdraw up to \$500 a pop. Say one is Robbed every night for one week. That's \$3,500 for that week.

You're average 7-11 holds about \$700 at 8:pm at night. It is extremely easy to get away with Robbing 7-11's. Rob one 3 nights a week, rotation which ones you rob throughout the state. That's \$2,100 for that week. Now, this is a lot of work, and you must not ever slack, so it would be unrealistic to say we will do this every day. But you could do it every day for 8 weeks with one person robbing ATM customers every night, and a 7-11 3 times a week, he's drawing in a minimum of \$5,600 a week. That's \$44,800 for his 8 week work period. You have 3 people

Doing this, that's a combined total of \$134,400 those three are taking in for their 8 week work period. And that's an absolute minimum.

Have one supervisor for their work weeks, who makes sure everything is solid before each move is done, and you had 3 people make \$130,000 in 8 weeks, flawlessly.

Notes: (on 1-5 "criminal moves") (excluded - SCAMS)

I've studied criminal behaviour and crimes until I was blue in the face. These are 5 crimes in which I just came up with based on my studies. I could come up with 10.

If one man tries to do all this at once it will be unrealistic. But if he fabricates an organization which will help him, and supervises it and coordinates it right, he can have all of these crimes done and money made.

These crimes still have to be gone over and checked for flaws, but once that is done, and there are no more flaws to the crimes. We have the flawless crime. It can be worked right, a crime done and got away with. Pretty easy actually. All it takes is solid people, and one mastermind.

Now, if an organization was created, and they executed the crimes of 1-5, that organization would be bringing a combined total of:

\$ 1,750,000 a year.

all the proof is on pages 9-16. Inarguable. Now, that is only illegal operations. Let alone legal. And other SCAMS I thought up! That label can triple. Soon, money would be of no consequence, and you

would have to put aspirations in other areas. like Power. With 25 loyal and obedient people, I could conquer Milwaukee in 5 years. I would be making so much money that I would have to do that.

If I had 25 people by my side, we would be on top. Nobody would be bigger.

The only problem is, how do you know someone is truly solid? Once I alleviate that problem, nothing will stand in my way. But, that is one hellafied problem.

Other crimes I omitted: (But will include after I am content they are well-done enough)

Home invasions: up to \$50,000 a pop

Murder/will sums: up to \$100,000 a pop

chop shops, legal/illegal: up to \$360,000 a year

BLACK market move: up to \$50,000 or \$500,000, depending

BANK jobs: minimum of \$500,000 a pop.

UNION move: (similar to extortion) up to \$150,000 a year



These are crimes still in their conception inside my head. Perhaps the upcoming ones, you will see them in here.

Those combined figures amount up to:

\$1,260,000 (estimating \$100,000 on BLACK market)

And that is excluding the yearly income

of the ones that bring in cash a pop.

BANK Job

The police ride around the city of Milwaukee on a grid. They frequently pass banks, jewelry stores, etc. To figure out the appropriate police grid, position 5 people around the bank. Either in a car, sitting on the bus stop, or whatever. 1 person who can see the bank, 1 person 2 or 3 blocks behind the bank, 1 person 2 or 3 blocks in front of the bank, and one person 2 or 3 blocks both east and west of the bank. They have a pen and paper handy, and a stopwatch. When a police car drives by, they take the serial # of the car, and hit the stopwatch. (On the average, he will roll back around in about 6 minutes.) When he comes past again, hit the stopwatch. If it reads 6 minutes, then cut that in half and that is the best time to move. In 3 minutes, he is farthest away from the bank. This is traveling at normal speed. When an alarm is hit, he will travel



at least twice as fast. Cut the 3 minutes in half again. You got 1 min 30 sec's to work. UNLESS . . .

Another crime TAKES PLACE, where he is called to go there. SAY, a convenience store blows up in his perimeter. (Another crime to be established) he has to go there. Chances are, the other CARS on the grid would go there also. Now we have up to 3 minutes again. (Don't want to overestimate.)

We have put extensive surveillance on the appropriate management in the bank. Say the manager and security guard both have daughters. A home invasion is to be initiated (another crime to be established) and daughter's and mother's is locked up in the cellar. The guard is told to go to work as normal, as is the manager, and also told that if at least \$500,000 dollars isn't won, without paintballs, or bugs, than KABOOM goes the basement their loved ones are housed in. CONSTANT surveillance is kept on the security guard and manager, and they know this so no funny business is taken place.

Then, 4 heavily armed, and appropriate

hired individuals come in, and announce  
 "BANK STICK UP" And they have a  
 police scanner strapped to their chest. They  
 say "If anybody pushes an alarm, I will  
 hear about it, and some people will get  
 sprayed." Then, you go to the manager  
 and say "fill it up" Then get in  
 the Get away CAR. You have the  
 1st & 2nd Rides be stolen, and you blow  
 up and burn each of them, then you  
 get in the 3rd CAR and get across  
 state lines, where the money is stashed.  
 You kill all weak links, kill the  
 manager and security guard A.S.A.P.  
 assassin style, their family, and any other  
 person who JUST MIGHT testify in  
 court. You burn the clothes to ash,  
 and bury the guns out in the  
 boon docks.

Some of the "HAS to be's" of the  
 shit:

1. No body could ever see skin, hair, or eyes that wasn't of the 7 people. Disguise would be needed where appropriate, complete Nylon covering in most circumstances.

2: No skin of the 7 people could ever touch any part of the bank, or 1st two get away cars, or the house where the hostages were taken. All hair must be restrained with both a hair net, and nylon covering.

3: All appropriate <sup>Attire</sup> would be 3 layered. The 1st being nylon, the 2nd denim, the 3rd cotton. Rubber gloves & leather gloves a must. Army boots a must.

4: The weak links of the 7 who were killed must be disposed of by a communitarian.

5: All affiliated clothes must be burned after use. (to ashes)

- The reason you couldn't hit it in the morning is because there are 3 doors to be opened. The 1st being the outside doors who security opens. Moves, etc. (Assassin minded)

Go to the Department of motor vehicles, expose fake FBI badge for more info, or file for F.O.I.A. for not as much. Then take the target person's social security # and either file for F.O.I.A. or pose as FBI and go to social security office, and there will be the current residence of target person, plus any other needed info for certain hits.

- BASIC ASSASSIN Rules
1. Never speak of a hit before or after its done
  - Also, never speak target's name.
  2. Always use communion clean-up, unless display was purpose of hit.

Re: Senate Bill 395 – Rights of Persons Civilly Committed under Chapter 980

We are writing to express the very strong opposition of the Wisconsin Coalition for Advocacy to Senate Bill 395. We believe that this bill is much too broad in that it strips very important rights protections from persons civilly committed under Chapter 980. The rights that it retains for this population are greatly restricted and may fall below Constitutional minimums. In effect, the Department's proposal turns many of the most basic human rights into privileges to be awarded based on the Department's determination of an individual's "management level". The bill also significantly undercuts the rationale that the Wisconsin Supreme Court used to uphold the Constitutionality of Chapter 980. Finally, we are dismayed by the gross misrepresentations made by the Department in its statements in support of this bill.

### The Department's Proposal Goes Way Beyond What is Needed to Address the Issues Raised by the Department

The Department's document entitled "Abuses of Patient Rights by SVPs" focuses on rights violations in the areas of telephone use, mail, restraints and seclusion, visitation, personal possessions, and the grievance procedure. However, in order to address these problems the Department proposes elimination of all the rights, in addition to those where there are problems, under Section 51.61, with the exception of a handful which are seriously restricted. The rights to be eliminated include the following:

- The right to receive prompt, adequate, and appropriate treatment
- The right to participate in the planning of one's treatment
- The right to treatment under the least restrictive conditions
- The right to religious worship
- The right to give informed consent to psychotropic medications
- The right to be free from excessive or unnecessary medications
- The right to be paid for work which financially benefits the facility
- The right to be free from inappropriate use of seclusion and restraints and to have such use strictly monitored
- The right to be treated with dignity and respect
- The right to a humane physical and psychological environment

- The right to consent to all experimental treatment, not just that which involves the use of a drug, surgical procedures, or drastic or extreme behavior modification
- The right to communicate with one's lawyer and government officials
- The right to confidentiality of treatment records
- The right to present grievances without fear of retaliation
- The right to be informed about any financial liability for the cost of treatment
- The right not to be filmed or taped without consent

In the place of these rights, the Department would bestow "institutional privileges" if the Department deems an individual's conduct to be sufficiently compliant. These new privileges include such fundamental rights as liberty to move around the unit, access to personal property including clothing, visitation, access to reading material, exercise and even religious worship.

The Department has used a meat ax when a scalpel would be more appropriate. Instead of eliminating all the rights, we propose to focus on just those where there are difficulties. In using this approach one must examine the power the Department already has to restrict the rights which appear to cause problems. The Department may limit the right to make telephone calls, the right to have visitors, and the right to personal possessions "for cause" or when "medically or therapeutically contraindicated". Section 51.61(2), Wis. Stats. However, they must document the reasons in the patient's chart and must give the patient the opportunity to grieve the decision. What is the problem with the current procedure? In the area of mail Department staff can inspect a patient's mail for contraband. Sec. 51.61 (1)(c), Wis. Stats. Are additional provisions needed for this particular population? In the area of seclusion and restraints the Department is currently being sued for over-use of these procedures pursuant to something called a "secure management plan" which is essentially using seclusion and restraint as punishment for patient misbehavior. We would strongly oppose any reduction in protections in this area. The grievance procedure is another identified problem area; however, can the current procedure be examined without throwing it out?

The Department also wants to implement a very controlling level system. The levels will differ as to how many rights/privileges are allowed patients. The level to which a particular individual is assigned is to be based not only on his own treatment and conduct, but also on things over which he has no control, such as management and security needs or *any other factor* the Department deems relevant.

However, they already have a level system and are allowed to restrict access to reading material, televisions, radios and other entertainment devices, engagement in exercise and other recreation or leisure activities all based on security or safety reasons and in some cases based on documented treatment or medical reasons. (See HFS 94.24 (3), Wis. Admin. Code.) In addition, as stated above they may limit or deny visitation, telephone use, and access to personal possessions. Instead of totally eliminating rights we would prefer to discuss the areas where there are problems which are not covered by current law or administrative code to see if some more modest modifications can be made.

## The Rights Retained/Created by the Bill May Not Meet Constitutional Minimums

The bill creates a very limited set of rights which are a modified subset of existing rights. In particular the rights are reduced from a list of 25 rights in the statute and an accompanying administrative code to 4 rights, two of which address the same topic. Even these four remaining rights have altered to provide less protection than their 51.61 counterparts. We do not believe that these are adequate for persons under civil commitment and as constituted, they may violate Constitutional protections.

The bill eliminates the right to give informed consent to psychotropic medication and replaces it with a very limited right to refuse such medication. (See current sec. 51.61(6) and compare it with proposed sec. 980.066(3)(c).) While this may appear to be a subtle distinction, it is quite significant. Under the right to give informed consent one must be informed of the risks and benefits and alternatives to the medication and must not be coerced in any way. (See HFS 94.03, Wis. Admin. Code.) Under the bill one theoretically has a right to refuse (although he would not be provided any information about risks, benefits, and alternatives). However, he could be punished for failure to “participate in prescribed treatment” by being put on a level that denies or limits “institution privileges”. This essentially ensures the people will be coerced into accepting treatment, including psychotropic medications. This flies in the face of the United States Supreme Court decisions of Vitek v. Jones and Washington v. Harper, which firmly established that all individuals possess a significant liberty interest in avoiding the administration of psychotropic drugs.

The bill also creates a right to give informed consent to drastic treatment procedures (as in current law) and a right to consent to experimental research or treatment that involves the use of any drug, ingested substance, surgical procedure or other drastic or extreme behavior modification techniques. (Sec. 980.066(3)(a).) He would have a right to be informed of other experimental treatment or research, but not to consent to it. (Sec.980.066(3)(c).) This deviates from existing law which requires informed consent for participation in all experimental research. (See sec. 51.61(1)(j).) It most likely also violates federal regulations on protection of human subjects and a series of court cases on experimental treatment with confined populations.

The bill creates a right to reasonable privacy in toileting and bathing, subject to the use of video and audio monitoring. (Sec. 980.066(3)(d).) This is hardly worth addressing since the “right” is so compromised as to be meaningless. However, it should be noted that under current law the right to privacy in toileting and bathing is one of the rights that staff may currently limit or deny based on “cause” or medical or therapeutic reasons.

In the area of seclusion and restraints the bill does require the Department to adopt policies. (Sec. 980.066(2)(c).) However, gone would be requirements that these procedures be ordered by medically appropriate personnel, that they be monitored to insure patient safety, that they be used for the shortest time possible, and that they be the least restrictive approach. (See sec. 51.61(1)(I), Wis. Stats.) Their use is also extended to locking people up at night, during shift change, and “as an emergency measure as needed for security purposes.” This does not meet existing standards of care for civilly committed patients and we do not believe it would meet the constitutional requirements set forth in Youngberg v. Romeo.



## The Bill Undercuts the Constitutionality of Chapter 980

The Department's proposal to diminish and decrease the patient rights now held by persons committed under Chapter 980 may raise serious questions regarding the very constitutionality of that underlying commitment law. Previous decisions in the United States and Wisconsin Supreme Courts which have upheld the constitutionality of laws like chapter 980 have expressly relied upon the fact that individuals committed under those laws, *including Wisconsin's*, were entitled to the same status as others who have been civilly committed, including the same conditions as any involuntary committed patient in the state mental institutions. The fact that these individuals were treated the same as all other civilly committed patients went far with the courts in establishing the purpose of these laws as true civil commitment, which is constitutionally permissible, and not as extended criminal punishment masquerading as commitment, which would be unconstitutional. The Department's proposal alters the balance of Chapter 980. If this proposal were to be enacted into law, persons committed under Chapter 980 would no longer be treated like other civilly committed persons, but instead in a way which would afford them fewer rights than these other patients. It is critical to note that the ex post facto and double jeopardy arguments against Chapter 980 were overcome in large part because of the clear distinction between rights they held as patients and the lesser rights recognized as belonging to prisoners. The Department's proposal blurs this distinction, makes the constitutionality of Chapter 980 as applied suspect, and will render Chapter 980 subject to attack in court and possible invalidation as unconstitutional.

The risks of the Department's approach are shown by an ongoing case in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit regarding the Washington state statute similar to Chapter 980. (Weston v. Young, 192 F.3d 870). The 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit has found that even though Washington's statute was constitutional on its face, in line with the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Kansas v. Hendricks, it could still be found to be unconstitutional as applied in Washington. The court listed claims alleged by the plaintiff, which if found to be true, would establish that his confinement was unconstitutional. The first such claim listed is that the plaintiff was subjected to more restrictive conditions than those placed on "true civil commitment detainees...." These claims are now undergoing trial at the District Court level.

The Department's proposal creates a dual standard of treatment and conditions for those civilly committed under Chapter 980 and those civilly committed under Chapter 51. The presence of such a dual standard has been found potentially unconstitutional in Weston v. Young and is in conflict with key parts of the reasoning in the United States and Wisconsin Supreme Court decisions upholding Chapter 980 and laws like it.

### Coverage of Section 51.61

We are extremely concerned about the substantial misrepresentations made by the Department in its discussion of who is covered by Section 51.61. Contrary to the Department's assertion that Section 51.61 was created to protect the "traditionally mentally ill" who are under civil commitment, this provision has provided protection, since its creation in the mid-1970's, to persons who are committed as incompetent to stand trial, as not guilty due to mental disease or defect, and as sexual psychopaths under the now repealed Chapter 975. Thus, these rights

provisions have always covered persons who have characteristics in common with individuals committed under Chapter 980. In addition, the testimony of Anthony Thomalla implies that persons receiving treatment for substance abuse are not covered by section 51.61. However, persons receiving substance abuse treatment have always been covered by this section. Thus, the Department and numerous community treatment providers have successfully provided treatment for persons who have committed crimes, who have substance abuse problems, and who have diagnoses of personality disorders as well as mental illnesses for over 25 years within the rights protections afforded by Section 51.61. We do not believe that the persons civilly committed under Chapter 980 are so substantially different from everyone else in the mental system that virtually all of their patient rights should be eliminated.

All of the above concerns are increased by the fact that there is no governmental oversight of the facility outside the Department. Previous to this Bill, WCA had developed serious concerns about the Department's adherence to the standards of patient rights for Chapter 980 patients, as incorporated in the current Section 51.61. There are several areas where our contact with patients and our own investigation has lead us to believe that the Department is not complying with the mandates of the legislature, as passed into law in section 51.61. Some of the areas which have caused us the greatest concern relate to use of seclusion and restraint under what the Department calls "Secure Management Plans", forced institutional labor, and inadequate medical care leading to patient death.

The issue of "Secure Management Plans" has become a high priority case for WCA. We undertook the representation of current WRC residents at the personal request of U.S. District Judge Lynn Adelman, in a case currently pending before him. This case involves the Department's use of "Secure Management Plans" to keep individuals secluded or restrained for periods of up to several months. Patients have been placed under such plans, despite findings by professionals employed at the institution that they did not and do not meet the statutory criteria for the use of seclusion and restrain, thus violating the requirements of the Wisconsin Statutes and the US Constitution.

#### Alternative Proposal to Address These Issues

WCA does not feel that such extreme and oppressive measures are necessary to address some of the problems raised as critical by the Department. More than half of the Department's anecdotal "rights abuses" are not even related to the illegal conduct that precipitated the patient's commitment under Chapter. 980, and are often related to areas where there are existing administrative code provision which could be modified to address these concerns.

Instead of totally eliminating rights we would prefer to discuss the areas where there are problems which are not covered by current law or administrative code to see if some more modest modifications can be made. WCA would be willing to meet with the Department, on an expedited basis, to attempt to reach agreement on what these modifications would be.

Relating to: committing theft against certain persons and providing a penalty.

By Representatives Suder, Albers, Ainsworth, Freese, Handrick, Hoven, Huebsch, Kelso, Ladwig, F. Lasee, Montgomery, Musser, Nass, Olsen, Plale, Powers, Turner and Vrakas; cosponsored by Senators Darling, Fitzgerald, Lazich, Roessler, Welch and Zien.

**Substitute Amendment Pending: At the request of DOJ and its Elder Law Advocate a substitute amendment (LRBs0307/1) was prepared to broaden the bill to address all forms of financial crimes against the elderly. The substitute amendment:**

1. Covers all financial crimes (e.g., attempted theft, theft, misappropriation of personal identifying information or documents, forgery, fraudulent writings, fraudulent destruction of certain writings.)
2. Protects all elderly people, regardless of capacity, place of residence or participation in programs.
3. Makes definition of "vulnerable adult" identical to the definition of that term used elsewhere in the statutes (e.g., Chapters 55, 813 and 940).
4. Includes all Powers of Attorney, whether durable or non-durable.

**Assembly Bill 562**

Relating to: creating a southeast Wisconsin crime abatement task force.  
By the Committee on Criminal Justice.

**Two Amendments Pending:**

**One amendment (LRBa1434/1), at the request of Reps. Krug and Riley adds the Chief of Police of the City of Milwaukee as a member of the task force.**

**The other amendment (LRBa1427/1) at the request of the State Bar of Wisconsin adds to the task force a member of the State Bar's Criminal Law Section who lives in the affected area, as well as a member of a local bar association for every county enumerated as part of the task force in the bill (i.e., Milwaukee, Kenosha, Racine, Rock and Waukesha).**

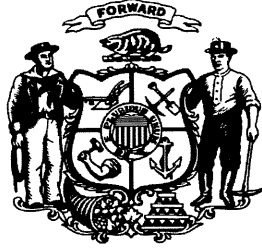

### **Assembly Bill 45**

Relating to: a hotline in the department of justice for the reporting of information regarding dangerous weapons in public schools.
