To required recommendations from the Election Board already contained in the bills, add:

- --EB to prepare recommendations about how the Department of Corrections could better educate prisoners leaving prison system on what their voting priviledges are
- --EB to prepare recommendations about how to improve the compliance of organizations engaging in independendent expenditures with Wisconsin elections laws requiring timely contribution and expenditure disclosures

Note: This amendment is meant to be the same as the one being drafting for Rep. ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT,

TO 2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 49

At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, line 5: delete "voter identification and registration" and substitute "the enforcement of certain election and campaign finance laws".
 - 2. Page 7, line 22: after that line insert:

"(51) VOTING BY FELONS. The elections board shall prepare recommendations with regard to how the department of corrections can better educate each individual who is convicted of a felony under the laws of this state as to that individual's rights and responsibilities with regard to voting in this state. No later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection, the elections board shall submit the recommendations to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature in the manner provided under section 13.172 (3) of the statutes.

(57) CAMPAIGN FINANCING. The elections board shall prepare recommendations with regard to improving compliance with disclosure requirements under chapter 11 of the statutes concerning disbursements made by any person who is required to file a statement under section 11.06 (7) of the statutes in order to provide voters with more complete and timely notice of the disbursements. No later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection, the elections board shall submit the recommendations to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature in the manner provided under section 13.172 (3) of the statutes."
