1 AN ACT *to create* 77.54 (14v) of the statutes; **relating to:** a sales and use tax 2 exemption for nonprescription drugs.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a sales tax and use tax exemption for nonprescription drugs. This bill will be referred to the joint survey committee on tax exemptions for a detailed analysis, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 77.54 (14v) of the statutes is created to read:
- 4 77.54 (14v) The gross receipts from the sale of and the storage, use, or other
- 5 consumption of nonnarcotic drugs which may be sold without a prescription and
- 6 which are prepackaged for use by consumers and labeled in accordance with the
- 7 requirements of state and federal law.
- 8 **SECTION 2. Effective date.**

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(1) NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS. This act takes effect on the first day of the 2nd
 month beginning after publication.
