Under this bill, each person under the age of 17 who is riding in or on the boat, of 26 feet in length or less, must wear a PFD during the time the boat is in operation. The bill also establishes a procedure under which a violator may receive a warning notice for their first violation. Fiscal Estimate: The fiscal impact of this bill is three fold: a stepped up informational campaign that promotes the wearing of PFD's, increased law enforcement presence to address non-compliance, and the development and implementation of a warning system for juvenile offenders. The informational campaign will require law enforcement officers to spend extra time with each boater to explain the law. This would reduce the number of contacts made with boaters per year. In addition, this proposal will require public service announcements on radio and television. This is estimated to cost \$40,000 per year. Approximately 70,000 contacts with boaters are made per year with current state law enforcement staffing. It is estimated that there will be, at a minimum, a 5% non-compliance rate with this proposal, even with the informational outreach. That equates to 3,500 boaters out of the 70,000 typically contacted who will be in violation. (Law enforcement typically contacts 7%-10% of the 850,000 boaters in this state). If citations were issued to 10% of the people contacted and warnings to the remaining 90%, then it would require 1.2 FTE additional effort to carry out this proposal (350 persons receiving citations x 1.50 hours per citation including court time/ 1830 hours per FTE)+ (3,150 persons receiving warnings x 0.50 hours per warning/1830 hours per FTE). The costs associated with the positions are: \$70,000 salary/fringe, \$16,800 travel allotment, and \$55,000 in one time equipment expenses - vehicles, radios, boats, policing equipment, computers and uniforms.

In addition, there are 102 local municipal water patrols that will be impacted by the proposal. It is estimated that in order to maintain the current level of contact and checks, an additional \$150,000 should be available for these local aids to cover the additional patrol hours.

Currently, the Department has an arrest record system that has links to the Department of Justice TIME system where data can be communicated statewide to all law enforcement. Modifications to the system to accommodate a warning citation will cost approximately \$10,000.
