- 1. You have requested a repeal of the provisions created in 1997 Acts 191 and 237 requiring a person to disclose his or her social security number (SSN). Please note that, under the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (PRWORA), each state must require a person's SSN to be recorded on any application for a professional, driver's, occupational, recreational, or marriage license, on any records relating to a judgment of divorce, support order, or paternity determination, and on every death certificate. A state that fails to enact these requirements risks losing federal funding for child and spousal support enforcement. Wisconsin passed 1997 Act 191 to comply with PRWORA. If enacted, this draft would jeopardize Wisconsin's receipt of federal funds.
