In fiscal year 2000, the department awarded grants to ten persons who had earned national certification through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards. First year grant recipients are awarded up to \$2,000 each. In fiscal year 2001, the department is expected to expend \$68,500: \$46,000 for 23 teachers who were awarded initial grants of up to \$2,000 each, and \$22,500 for nine grantees from fiscal year 2000 (one of the original ten recipients no longer resides in Wisconsin and is not eligible to receive a grant under current law) who will receive \$2,500 each. This bill would result in increased expenditures from the appropriation under s. 20.255 (3)(c), Wis. Stats., if residents of other states who teach in Wisconsin's schools attain national teacher certification. It is unknown how many nonresidents who are Wisconsin teachers will earn national teacher certification and become eligible for state grants, so the fiscal effect of this bill is indeterminable.
