I am requesting a bill draft for the 2001 session to amend statute 139.03 (5) (b) 2, to change the amount of liquor and wine that may be brought into the country by members of the National Guard, Armed Forces or Reserves; who are residents of Wisconsin. The bill should change it from 6 liters to 16 liters.

AN ACT ...; relating to: the occupational tax on intoxicating liquor and wine that

is brought into this state from a foreign country.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, an occupational tax is imposed on the sale of intoxicating liquor and wine. A person who is a state resident and a member of the national guard, armed forces or armed forces reserve who is returning to this state from duty or training in a foreign country may bring into the state intoxicating liquor or wine in an aggregate amount not exceeding six liters without paying the occupational tax on that amount.

Under this bill, a person who is a state resident and a member of the national guard, armed forces or armed forces reserve who is returning to this state from duty or training in a foreign country may bring into the state intoxicating liquor or wine in an aggregate amount not exceeding 16 liters without paying the occupational tax on that amount.

This bill will be referred to the joint survey committee on tax exemptions for a detailed analysis, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 139.03 (5) (b) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:

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139.03 (5) (b) 2. A person who is a member of the national guard, the U.S.
armed forces or a reserve component of the U.S. armed forces; who is a state resident;
and who leaves a foreign country, after spending at least 48 hours in that foreign
country on duty or for training, with the purpose of entering into this state may bring
into the state, in sealed original containers and in the person's immediate possession,
intoxicating liquor and wine in an aggregate amount not exceeding 6 16 liters
without paying the tax imposed under this subchapter on that amount.
