1	AN ACT <i>to amend</i> 347.06 (1), 347.09 (1) (intro.), 347.13 (1) and 347.16 (1) (intro.),
2	(a) and (b) of the statutes; relating to: requiring headlamps and other required
3	lamps on a school bus to be lighted whenever the school bus is operated on a
4	highway.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with certain exceptions, no person may operate a motor vehicle upon a highway during hours of darkness unless all headlamps, taillamps, and clearance lamps with which the vehicle must be equipped are lighted.

Under this bill, no person may operate a school bus upon a highway at any time unless all required headlamps, taillamps, and clearance lamps for the school bus are lighted.
