Childcare Education and Training Scholarship Program

Issue:

With the substantial growth of Wisconsin's economy and workforce over the past decade, the pool of potential employees in the state has shrunk considerably, particularly in the service industry, resulting in a legitimate labor shortage.

Nowhere has the labor shortage had more of a critical impact than in the childcare industry. Childcare facilities across Wisconsin are staffed with underpaid, and in many cases, under qualified childcare workers. At the same time, because childcare is already one of the biggest expenses for many families, most childcare facilities are unable to raise prices, and are thus forced to freeze wages, leading to high turnover rates and the loss of their best employees.

Unfortunately, this "crises" has led to a situation in which many of Wisconsin's children are receiving substandard care outside of the home.

Potential Solution:

Establish a statewide scholarship grant program that would award scholarships to childcare providers or those employed by childcare providers to obtain or work towards an associate or bachelor's degree in the field of childcare or early childhood education.

- **Funding Source** – The grant program would be funded through proceeds raised by selling colorful commemorative birth certificates and marriage licenses suitable for framing. The commemorative licenses and certificates could be sold for a set amount, such as \$35. Development, administrative and advertising costs would be minor and would be paid for strictly with program revenue.

In 1999, there were 65,955 births in Wisconsin and 35,754 couples were married. If 25% of those couples who were married and 25% of those parents who had children in 1999 had purchased commemorative marriage licenses or birth certificates, \$889,953.75 in program revenue would have been raised.

- **Scholarship Amounts** – The scholarships would cover the cost of the recipient's tuition and books up to a maximum of \$5,000. The recipient would be required to enter into a contract with the Department of Health and Family Services and, if applicable, the childcare provider employing the recipient. The contract must contain all of the following:

1. The amount of the scholarship, subject to the \$5,000 limit.

2. The number of credit hours to be taken during the course of the contract as well as the total length of the contract.
3. A commitment by the recipient to remain employed by the childcare provider for the length of the contract and for at least 6 months after the end of the contract. If the recipient is a childcare provider, they must make a commitment to remain a childcare provider for at least 6 months after the end of the contract

The amount of scholarships awarded could not exceed the amount of program revenue available.

- **Administration** – The Department of Health and Family Services would be directed to develop and create the Commemorative Marriage License and Birth Certificate Program, including all necessary advertising. The Department would also be directed to administer the scholarship program.

AN ACT ...; relating to: a child care career education and training scholarship program, the sale of commemorative birth certificates and marriage certificates to fund that program, and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of workforce development (DWD) administers various grant programs relating to child care. Those grant programs include a child care resource and referral services grant program, a child care start-up and expansion grant program, a child care quality improvement grant program, and an early childhood excellence initiative.

This bill creates a child care career education and training scholarship program to be administered by DWD. Under the program, DWD may award scholarships of not more than \$5,000 to individuals who are child care providers or are employed by a child care provider to enable those individuals to earn associate degrees or bachelor's degrees in the fields of child care or early childhood education. Under the program, DWD, a scholarship recipient, and, if applicable, the scholarship recipient's employer must enter into a contract specifying the commitments of each party to the contract. The contract must include the amount of the scholarship, which, subject to the \$5,000 maximum scholarship limit, may cover up to 100% of the cost of the scholarship recipient's books and tuition; the time period of the contract and the number of credits the scholarship recipient will take during that time period; and a commitment by the scholarship recipient not to resign from employment with the child care provider that employed him or her during the time period of the contract for ~~not less than~~ six months after the end of that period as specified in the contract or, if the scholarship recipient is an individual who is a child care provider, to remain

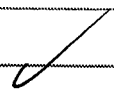

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of workforce development (DWD) administers various grant programs relating to child care. Those grant programs include a child care resource and referral services grant program, a child care start-up and expansion grant program, a child care quality improvement grant program, and an early childhood excellence initiative.

This bill creates a child care career education and training scholarship program to be administered by DWD. Under the program, DWD may award scholarships of not more than \$5,000 to individuals who are child care providers or are employed by a child care provider to enable those individuals to ~~earn associate degrees or bachelor's degrees~~ in the fields of child care or early childhood education. Under the program, DWD, a scholarship recipient, and, if applicable, the scholarship recipient's employer must enter into a contract specifying the commitments of each party to the contract. The contract must include the amount of the scholarship, which, subject to the \$5,000 maximum scholarship limit, may cover up to 100% of the cost of the scholarship recipient's books and tuition; the time period of the contract and the

number of credits the scholarship recipient will take during that time period; and a commitment by the scholarship recipient not to resign from employment with the child care provider that employed him or her during the time period of the contract for at least six months after the end of that period as specified in the contract or, if the scholarship recipient is an individual who is a child care provider, to remain a child care provider for not less than six months after the end of the time period of the contract as specified in the contract.

The bill also directs the state registrar of vital statistics to design commemorative birth certificates and marriage certificates that are suitable for display and to issue the certificates to any person who submits a written request and pays a \$42 fee. Thirty-five dollars of the fee must then be used for providing the scholarships authorized under the bill and for administering that scholarship program and the sale of the commemorative certificates.
