

- 2. The malicious failure of the owner or operator or the employees or agents of the owner or operator to warn against an unsafe condition on the campground property, of which the owner or operator knew".

This bill provides immunity from civil liability to owners and operators of private campgrounds and to their employees and agents. The immunity applies to property damage or personal injury or death of an individual if the damage, injury, or death is the proximate result of the act or omission of a person other than the owner or operator of the private campground or the employees or agents of the owner or operator.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 895.523 of the statutes is created to read:

895.523 Liability exemption; private campgrounds. (1) In this section:

(a) "Private campground" means a facility that is issued a campground permit under s. 254.47 and that is owned and operated by someone other than a public agency.
