(1) STUDY ON PROMOTING ECONOMIC GROWTH AND EFFICIENCY. The department of revenue shall study options for restructuring shared revenue and tax incremental financing to encourage high-growth sectors of the economy, creation of high-quality jobs, and to encourage efficient development patterns that have low per unit costs for providing public infrastructure and service delivery.
