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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB 243 prohibits state agencies from appointing to a state position a person who is not registered for Selective Service although required to register.

This bill would have no fiscal effect on hiring in state agencies. The bill would require agency hiring managers to check for Selective Service registration before appointing a person required to register, not before evaluating candidates or interviewing. At the point of job offer, agencies would need to ask the candidate if he is required to register of Selective Service. If the candidate is required to register, a hiring manager would need to collect the candidate's social security number and check the Selective Service's web site to verify registration. If the candidate is not registered the hiring agency could not appoint that candidate.

This step would have minimal impact on the hiring process.
