<b>Subject</b> Restrictions on state employment and student financial aids for failure to comply with selective service registration		

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB 340 would direct the Wisconsin Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) to require that all students receiving state financial assistance register with Selective Service, if they are required to do so.

Any student who has not registered with Selective Service would not be eligible for state financial assistance administered by HEAB.

Currently, all students applying for federal financial aid must register with Selective Service in order to receive the aid. To ensure compliance with this federal law, the federal government runs a cross check with the Selective Service. When a student has applied for federal aid without registering for Selective Service, the federal processor notifies HEAB.

Since Selective Service registration is not currently required in order to receive Wisconsin financial assistance, this data is currently not being loaded on to our student record system. It would require computer programming time in order for this information to be brought in to our state record system from the federal data file.

Estimated programming related costs are as follows:

Staff Time 100 hours at \$19.1691/hour = \$1916.90

Fringe Benefits \$764.00

CPU Time 10 hours at \$0.32/sec = \$11,304.00

Total \$13,984.90

HEAB also administers non need based financial assistance programs that do not require the filing of the federal financial aid application e.g. the Academic Excellence Scholarship Program and the MN/WI Reciprocity Program. Therefore, an information collection process would need to be implemented for all non need based programs that we administer.

Cost associated with establishing this process is unknown.
